Mayor's Comments

Holiday Greetings from your City Hall!

On behalf of all of our outstanding City Staff and Board of Aldermen, best of holiday wishes for all residents and loved ones. May 2020 bring nothing but good health and happiness to us all!

As Chief Davis mentions in his column, our Police Department is participating in the Platte County Sheriff's 'Shop with a Cop' on Saturday, December 7th. Checks and cash are being accepted at City Hall.

Mark your calendars now for our annual St Patrick's Day festivities scheduled for March 14th, 2020. Sponsored by our very active Irish American Club, these festivities are a benefit for our fine Weatherby Lake Police Department.

As I have mentioned previously, if you observe anything but safe driving as you travel through the intersection of Eastside Drive and Barry Road, please, please pay close attention to any dangerous event and call the Kansas City, MO --311-- hotline and report the incident to them. The more negative calls they get on this intersection increases the chance that KCMO will do something to correct what we all agree is the potential for a very dangerous environment..

The Public Works department has completed street patch work for the year, including the Community Center parking lot. We have purchased a fourth salt spreader so we can now plow and spread salt with all four of our city trucks. George has ordered 300 tons of salt for this year and our salt bin is now full with 200 tons. Each snow / ice event requires between 20-35 tons of salt. Here's hoping we don't use much this season!!

The emergency alternative water connection with Water District #6 is in the final stages of legal work and we anticipate being ready to start construction this next Spring. The Westside Lift Station property issue is still grinding through protracted legalities by Kansas City Water Services. It has taken two separate appeals by me to KCMO Mayor Quinton Lucas to 'kick start' the process.

The Weatherby Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Committee consists of city members Armand Matthews, Beth Moraitis, Tim Vlamis, Emily Hansen and Alderman Don Hoy. Their purpose is to educate citizens and monitor the quality of storm water entering and exiting our lake. The committee encourages the use of fertilizers that reduce the phosphate and nitrogen runoff into the lake and reminds citizens to pickup after their pets. There is a free key chain pet bag dispenser available for folks to pick up at City Hall.

REMINDER: Christmas and New Years Day will cause trash and recycle pickups to be on the following Saturday!

WLIC Update

Happy Holidays from the WLIC! We are ready for our "long winter's nap". C Point and the Access Areas have been winterized. The ice recovery equipment is being prepped and will be stationed at the corner of the property at 10208 NW 73rd Terr., similarly to last year.

The WLIC Annual Meeting was held on November 12th with approximately 200 in attendance. Two new directors, James Miller & Bryan Ballard, and two returning directors, Steve Ogden and Rick Neece were elected to three-year terms. The results of the Member Survey on the property at 10208 NW 73rd Ter. were presented with the greenspace option being overwhelmingly favored by those taking the survey. Presentations by our dam engineers, related to the utilization of the property and the results of their lake bottom survey which tracks the buildup of lake siltation over time was also presented at the meeting. A highlight of the meeting was the presentation of the Joseph A. Sherman Award to our own Dale Kinne for his volunteer efforts at the Lake.

The new Board held their first meeting the following week on Tuesday, November 19. At that meeting, the following slate of officers was elected for the year 2020.

Annual Assessment & Lake Use Permit Fee Statements as well as your Lake Use Permit & Waiver/ Consent forms are in the mail. Please turn your forms in with your payments, if possible, to avoid delays with receiving your permits. **Also due for the year of 2020 is our Lake Use Re-education. The WLIC Office will inform you as soon as the course is available.** As soon as they receive all of the above items, the office will be able to issue your bracelets and lake use permits for 2020.

Also, the WLIC Environmental Trust will be co-sponsoring an educational, hands-on, workshop for the youth of our community related to maintaining a healthy environment and eco system for the Lake and surrounding communities. The workshop will be held on Saturday, December 7th at the community Center and the Wildwood West Detention Pond area. Hands on activities will include how plants, water, butterflies, bees, birds – and goats! -- can work together to support and improve our environment. Please have your 3rd and 4th graders sign up now. It's free and a lunch-and-learn will be provided.




