Mayor's Comments

Now that we find ourselves into Autumn again, I ask myself 'wasn't it just Spring a month or so ago?'

The picture with this article was taken at the Citywide surprise birthday party we had in early August for long time employee and Public Works Director, George Lowman. I will echo former Mayor Jerry Bos when I say, 'George is the brother I never had!'

I can't emphasize enough when I ask all to close your garage doors and lock all vehicles left outside day and night. Please help our Police help you by doing so.

The following is Part 2 of the aircraft noise issue. It is written by my friend Captain R.E. 'Bud' Potts a chief pilot for a large, worldwide commercial carrier put into layman's terms.

We are blessed to have such an incredible airport near our neighborhood - and it sure makes it easier for our personal and professional travel – to easily get to faraway places, or to simply drop and pick up our families and friends. And we can't forget about the great deal of positive commerce that having an airport like MCI brings to the greater KC area. It has been proven not just in our community, but in communities across the USA- that property values go up with convenient air travel options nearby.

Talk to your friends in South Kansas City or in Overland Park and they will share with you how much they lament the distance that they have to travel to get to the airport. They would trade the distance that they have travel – with us – in a minute.

But, with the wonderful things we enjoy with an airport nearby, it is only fair to recognize some of the 'less than perfect' aspects as well. In a perfect world, we would love to have all of the benefits of an international airport without ANY of the noise. It's a goal that is admirable, but probably not completely realistic.

I do have some perspective for you to consider- when we look at the majority of the flight operations and the normal traffic flow that the Air Traffic Control (ATC) Team utilizes at MCI, allow me take a moment and share a few details about MCI that you may not be aware of.

Regarding planes taking off from MCI:

MCI employs six different Standard Instrument Departures or 'SIDS'. **Think of them as 'Sidewalks'. So, these are the sidewalks that get you to the street, that in turn get you to the highways in the sky. Of the six sidewalks that are available for use at MCI, only ONE of those sidewalks puts any aircraft anywhere remotely near our community.

So then this creates the question of "WHY" would the ATC Controllers ever choose to use the sidewalk that might put an airplane nearer to our neighborhood? The answer is, "It is necessary in certain instances." The Controllers try to avoid taking any aircraft right over our neighborhood, but they also have to balance other traffic either passing through their control sector such as aircraft that may be using the downtown airport. It is their job to keep airborne traffic separated. Weather avoidance for aircraft taking off can also play a factor.

Concerning aircraft that are taking off to the south, it is important to know that there are already many noise abatement or noise reduction procedures in place designed to keep the departing aircraft clear of our neighborhood. For those times when it cannot be avoided, these same procedures that pilots utilize are industry proven to provide the smallest noise footprint possible, to reduce the amount of noise that we hear on the ground.

Please don't shoot the messenger. We will always do our part in city management to make sure the KCI Team remains a good partner to Weatherby Lake. I hope that you have found this to be helpful. Steve Clark, Mayor

Kops Korner

As summer winds down and school has started the traffic has increased on our roadways. School busses, parents and children at bus stops are present every weekday morning and afternoon. Over the summer months the city has painted six "25 MPH" signs on different roadways to remind motorists of the speed limit. Recent traffic surveys conducted on Eastside Drive revealed **15 K** vehicles travel on this roadway in a seven day time period. With all the above factors involved I would like to remind everyone to adhere to the posted speed limit while driving our streets.



Recently, we experienced late summer severe weather/storms/hail and minor flooding. To be notified of inclement weather conditions, roadway closings or power outages, etc., I would encourage you to sign up for Nixle notifications. The Nixle link is located on the bottom of the City of Weatherby Lake web page <http://www.cityofweatherbylake-mo.gov>. Click on the Nixle logo to begin sign up for the notifications.

The Weatherby Lake Police Department will be hosting a **FREE** four hour American Red Cross AED/CPR class on November 10th, 2019. Assistant Chief Hachman will be conducting the class 9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. at the Weatherby Lake City Hall 7200 N.W. Eastside Drive WLMO. Please RSVP by contacting city hall (816-741-5545) as class size is limited.

In past week(s) during the overnight hours at least ten (10) motor vehicles were entered and some of the contents were stolen. During the same time frame one vehicle was entered and stolen as the ignition key was left inside the vehicle. In **ALL** cases the vehicles were parked outdoors with the vehicle door(s) left **UNLOCKED!!** I would like to remind everyone to secure all vehicle door(s) when parked outdoors. I would also suggest that all walk-in and overhead garage door(s) be secured when not in use. During the months of June/July/August between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. the WLPD located **183 open residence garage door(s)**. In each instance WLPD attempted to contact the residence owners and request they close the open overhead garage doors.

The Weatherby Lake Improvement Company has reminded me that no person should leave **ANY** valuables unattended on their boat or while at any Access Area.

In past weeks the Police Department has been notified of animal violations. City ordinance 385.150 reads in part: *House Pets*. No animals other than domestic dogs and cats are allowed in the district. Up to three (3) animals may be kept in each house in the City.

WLIC Update

Fall is here! The Annual Meeting is around the corner – 7PM, Tuesday, November 12th at the Hilton Kansas City Airport Hotel. Please mark your calendars. Other dates to remember:

- Call for Directors was due September 27th to have your Bio included in the Annual Meeting Packet which will be mailed in October. However, additional names may be placed in nomination from the floor at the Annual Meeting and may be written in on the ballot.
- Call for Credentials & Election Committee Members – Due October 21st.
- Completion of Membership Survey on the Dam Property Concepts – Due October 4th.
- Last Day to Submit Objections to Proposed Rules & Regulations Changes – Due October 9th.

The results of the Membership survey on the Dam Property will be discussed at the Annual Meeting together with additional information on the impact to the dam property as presented in the questionnaire. There will also be discussion on the increased liability and insurance costs related to activities at the Dam Property.

The Lake Bottom Survey was updated by our Dam Engineering consultants, Affinis Corp. and the Board will be discussing its results at the next Board Meeting and possibly at the Annual Meeting as well.

Recent activities on the Lake have brought to light several situations which the WLIC believes should be brought to the Membership's attention. First, docks and boats on the Lake are private property. If you are on someone's dock or boat without their permission, you are trespassing and may be prosecuted. The WLIC has been notified that this has occurred at several lake events during the summer. Only the WLIC courtesy and swimming docks, which are marked with a blue "WLIC Dock" sign and does not have a Member's Block/Lot ID on it, are available to all WLIC Members to use on a temporary basis (fishing, temporary parking, swimming, etc. – no overnight parking).

Second, during the recently completed Triathlon at the Lake there were concerns raised about the procedures and communication at the event regarding lightning and storm weather, as well as parking concerns arising from the event. A meeting was held between triathlon organizers, the City of Weatherby Lake and WLIC representatives to refine and strengthen these procedures for the future.

Next, there were some Member concerns raised regarding the growing presence of radio-controlled boats on the Lake. A meeting was held with the City Police Chief, the WLIC President and several Members who have or will have RC Boats. The Members agreed to develop policies and practices regarding the use of these boats on our Lake to better ensure the safety and enjoyment of all Members at the Lake. These recommendations will be discussed at the next monthly WLIC Board of Directors meeting.

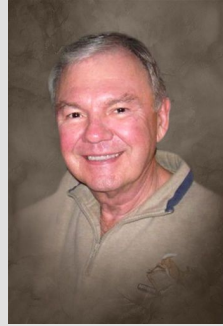


CANINE DYSAUTONOMIA. Bet you've never heard of it. Until last Sunday, we lifetime dog owners had not either; when after four days our Wendy was put to sleep because of this devastating disease. So, we delved into research studies and corresponded with the heads of the Veterinary Medicine Schools at K-State and MU. We read countless posts on a dedicated dysautonomia facebook page from owners whose dogs also died of the disease. All of the information supported the following conclusions and should be common knowledge for pet owners.

This is not a common disease, but currently a 'hot spot' is the KC area extending to St. Joseph, and in Kansas and Missouri last year, there were 100 combined cases. No medicine to reverse the course exists. The early symptoms are easily missed, and in as few as two to three days, the disease's rapid, and vicious progression severely damages the dog's nervous system. Early symptoms are: Persistent vomiting (Wendy vomited yellow bile), Regurgitation, Refusal of food, Straining to poop or urinate with or without diarrhea, Hot, dry crusty nose, Dilated pupils, Dry eyes due to no tear production, and Extreme lethargy. I urge you to click the links to the University of Wyoming's research pages. Dr. Ken Harkin of K-State wrote in his letter to us: "In terms of prevention: I keep my dogs away from fresh dirt piles and don't let them drink from puddles in the winter (or eat dead things, although cicadas seem pretty safe since my dogs eat tons of them)."

Hindsight is indeed 20/20, but if we had just been aware of this disease and associated risk factors, we would have been able to reduce Wendy's exposure to them. It's not a given, but perhaps with early diagnoses, she could have pulled through. Knowledge is the key. With additional funding, the necessary research to confirm the suspected cause and develop a vaccine might someday be a reality. May it be so. 

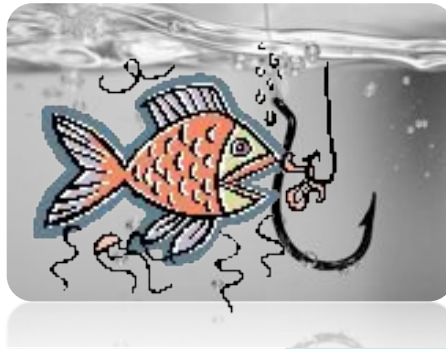
