

REMEMBERING RICK NOBLE Don Coleman

Weatherby Lake resident Rick Noble passed away on March 9 after a long illness. His long-time friend, Don Coleman, shared his memories of Rick and his contributions to our community.

Rick Noble was dedicated to making Weatherby Lake a great community. His passion for protecting our lake's environmental health was inspiring. He spent thousands of volunteer hours and offered indispensable legal expertise to defend the quality of our water and ensure that future generations would be able to enjoy it for years to come.



Rick and I met in the early 1990s when he moved to the lake. We quickly became good friends, with similar thoughts about improving and protecting the environment. We built a team of environmental advocates known as the "Mud Rasslers" who fought hard to protect our lake.

We collaborated on several projects that our residents benefit from today, including C Point's sandy beach and swim dock. We also facilitated the Weatherby Lake Improvement Company's purchase of a very inexpensive and crucial plot of land at Barry Road referred to as the "Bean Field" to protect the Lake from unwanted commercial development.

One of Rick's most significant contributions was successfully leading litigation against real estate developers who were polluting and silting our lake, forcing us to close it for swimming and boating because it was simply too dangerous.

We won largely because of Rick's strong command of the law, his relentless devotion to the cause, and his grit. To build his case, he spent countless hours with the other Mud Wrestlers on cold, rainy nights tracing sources of muddy water flooding into the lake, collecting water samples and diligently recording results for use as evidence. And he did it all for free.

Rick set a standard for leadership and public service that survives today. The next generation of Weatherby Lake's leaders inherit the privilege and responsibility of carrying on Rick's stalwart protection of our lake as new environmental threats emerge.

Rick's contributions were immense. I hope he is forever included in our history and fondly remembered for all he did to make Weatherby Lake the wonderful place it is to live today.

Mayor's Comments

Welcome Spring!

Starting on a positive note, how about those Chiefs and winning a most exciting Super Bowl! It was a very long time coming but the excitement was very well worth the wait! Hard to believe it's already been two long months ago.

Since then however our world has changed. Drastically. Events, activities and sports have been canceled, delayed and postponed; locally and nationally. We all have been affected personally, maybe financially and certainly in our everyday lives.

Things change in life so very quickly and I want to assure all that your City has been trying to stay ahead of the curve as things have changed, sometimes hourly. Police Chief Kevin Davis, Emergency Management Coordinator Carlton Voorhies and myself have been attending meetings held by the Platte County Health and Sheriff's Department. Within a very few hours of us attending these meetings the news media broadcasts what we have just learned.

What began with crowd sizes of 1000 to 500 to 250 to 100 to 10, now we are observing 'social distancing'. Because of the months of extensive advance planning by Julie and Michael Horseman and their large group of volunteers we all determined on Friday evening March 13th to proceed with the St Patrick's Day event the next day when the maximum crowd number was 250. While I don't know the final head count it's my belief that ours was somewhere around 200. It was a great event and my hat is off to Julie, Michael and their entire team of volunteers! Many thanks to them and all who attended a fantastic event!

Because of the 'social distancing' that went into effect Monday, March 16th it was determined by Chief Davis, Coordinator Voorhies, the Park Board and myself to temporarily remove the basketball hoops at the Community Center and Cristhaven Park. Typically during evenings and weekends from this time of year thru October there are anywhere from 10-40 players on that court. With those hoops removed the next logical stop for those players would have been the half court at Cristhaven Park. With more than 10 players observed at the volleyball court that net was removed too. For now the tennis court nets remain but we are observing them for more than 10 there too.

The US Census is currently being taken and I ask that all please take the time to fully complete it. Our April 3rd election has been postponed by Governor Parsons to June 2nd. Check the City website <u>www.cityofweatherbylake-mo.gov</u> for any important updates.

Now for the good news; it's Spring and time to get out and enjoy the warming weather. See you on the lake!



A Letter from the WLIC President...

As social distancing fatigue wears thin and the warmer weather begins to bloom, it is natural to let our guard down when it comes to stemming the tide of COVID-19. Unfortunately, medical

experts estimate the next month is when our local "curve" will grow the most. Now is the time we Weatherby Lakers need to shore up our resolve to Keep Calm and Weatherby On! We are at a critical juncture.

Our community is full of things to do to keep our minds, spirits and bodies healthy during this difficult time. We ask our Membership to continue the practice of social distancing whether socializing at one of our 19 Access Areas (yes, there are 19!) or while out on the water. Keep in mind, while on the water multiple boat tie-ups are discouraged at this time and the 6-foot recommendation applies while on watercraft as well.

We are working as hard to process 2020 wristbands and permits. This year we are having to manage 100% of them from our remote offices and distribute via US mail. The process is arduous and time consuming. We value your patience. In the meantime, if you would like to use the WLIC facilities or lake, please wear your 2019 green bracelets and make sure your watercraft/floats display last year's permits. When you receive your 2020 credentials, please begin using those.

Here are just a few ideas of how you can stay active at Weatherby -- all while adhering to social distancing recommendations.

- Visit by land or sea, each one of our 19 Access Areas. Learn the name and location of each Access Area. A map is available at http://wlic.org/lake-map.html
- Adopt an Access Area. Each year after the winter thaw, our Access Areas need a little sprucing up. Picking up trash and reporting damage to WLIC docks or other Access Area amenities is a great help to our volunteer-based operations.
- Visit the Anders-Jacks historic cemetery located on Eastside Drive, adjacent to 75th Terrace.
- Read the Weatherby Lake Chronicles. Published by the Weatherby Lake Historical Committee, it's an historic account of how Weatherby Lake today, grew from the efforts of many volunteer Members before us.

Together, but apart, we make a difference!

WEATHERBY LAKE GARDEN CLUB

The following ideas for New perennials and annuals may be just what you need to add to your Flower beds. **Enjoy** and **Happy Spring!**!

Perennials: Hardy Hibiscus - 'Disco Belle Rosy Red' and 'Honeymoon Deep Red'- huge 8" blooms. Grows 2- 3 feet high.

Daylilies - 'Pretty Woman' - a blend of rose with yellow green throat. Blooms last 16 hours.

Hosta's - 'Christmas Tree' - has a heavy substance that makes it slug resistant. Groundcover - Sedum -'Boogie Woogie' - yellow flowers. Low maintenance and drought tolerant. 'Class Act' - stunning rose-pink flowers. 'Popstar' - salmon pink flowers.

Annuals: Artemesia - 'Sea Salt' - a filler for pots. Grows 6-19" tall. Likes hot & sunny. Silver. Begonia - 'Viking Red on Chocolate' - intense red flowers on brown foliage. Vigorous grower.

Lantana - 'Hot Blooded' - multicolor in red, orange and yellow. Does not stop blooming.

Coleus - 'Heartbreaker' - nonfading. Lovely pink with green edge.

'Colorblaze Wicked Hot' - ruffled orange.

'Black Coral' - deep black-purple growing 12-18".

To Prune or Not to Prune:

Do not prune Lilacs right now. Prune within 2 weeks of the end of the bloom period. Prune Roses now cutting back by half.

Spirea can be cut severely in early-early spring.

Evergreens should be allowed to put out new growth before pruning.

Internet sites are valuable to instruct on proper pruning.

On a Saturday of each month at 7:00 PM, September thru May, volunteer Weatherby Lake residents rotate hosting a casual social gathering in their homes. There are two options for the gatherings each month, either a casual sit-down meal or a Happy Hour style gathering with just appetizers. A host determines the number of guests they have. Neither the host nor the guest knows the identity of the other guests ahead of time.




