From the Editor

Our goal is to make 2020 the healthiest year **you have ever lived**, and to make Weatherby Lake and KC metro the healthiest place on the planet!

Is modern day technology killing your family? Are you aware there is a higher mortality (death) rate for someone with a hunch in their spine (called hyperkyphosis)? When the head goes forward or off center, it puts pressure on the rest of the spine and if left untreated, the spine will slowly degenerate and continue forward, while the upper back goes backward creating a hunch. A good rule of thumb is for every inch your head is off center, it creates a doubling of the weight of your head as perceived by your body. So if a 10 pound head is forward one inch the effective weight on your spine is 20 pounds, not 10. If it's forward 2 inches the effective weight is 30 pounds.

Every study done of this condition indicates there a higher mortality rate among people with hyperkyphosis because there is less room in the thoracic cavity and consequently, it compromises lung function.

My major concern - THIS IS NO LONGER A CONDITION SEEN ONLY IN ELDERLY! Because of texting and games/ videos and devices, we are seeing this forward head carriage (the beginning of the kyphosis) in more and more children and adolescents.

According to the mayo clinic website, some Complications of kyphosis;

- Breathing problems. Severe kyphosis can put pressure on the lungs.
- Limited physical functions. Kyphosis is associated with weakened back muscles
 and difficulty doing tasks such as walking and getting out of chairs. The spinal
 curvature can also make it difficult to gaze upward or drive and can cause pain when
 you lie down.
- **Digestive problems.** Severe kyphosis can compress the digestive tract, causing problems such as acid reflux and difficulty with swallowing.
- Body image problems. People with kyphosis, especially adolescents, may develop a poor body image from having a rounded back or from wearing a brace to correct the condition. For older people, poor body image can lead to social isolation.


