This spring the WLIC conducted its first prescribed burn of the dam and spoils area. Burning fields and dams is a practice endorsed by the Missouri Department of Conservation to encourage healthy ecosystems, habitats and erosion prevention.

While burning seems counter-intuitive, it actually brings with it many benefits

- Stimulates healthy diverse turf....gets rid of thatch build-up so turf can thicken and stabilize the dirt.
- Reduces the spread of invasive species.
- Very cost and time effective vs. mowing

From the Editor

A new beginning can occur at any time...it doesn't have to be on January 1, or when we have a certain birthday, or a special event. We can begin anew at any time, or for any reason. The thing we should be paying attention to is recognizing when we become aware that a new beginning is possible.

Frequently, new beginnings are more easily trusted if they are manageable, or we at least perceive them to be manageable. I believe that we all agree to doable new beginnings more than we realize. Just as a new beginning doesn't have to be connected to any certain time or event, it doesn't have to be connected to any specific activity either. Although, there are lots of those examples to draw from. We give up a certain indulgence at a certain date for a certain period of time in some religious cultures, and this might lead one



to a temporary new beginning. More memberships at the fitness centers are obtained the first week in January than any other time. Few are sustained long enough to become a lasting new beginning.

Again, as long as we recognize that new beginnings are possible, we can give ourselves permission to explore. How tragic if we would not have new beginnings to look forward to and miss the opportunity to become more. My wish for you (and me) is the best of all new beginnings possible. Especially, as we transition thru all that Weatherby Lake sets before us each new day.

WLIC Update

Informational Town Hall: As most Members are aware, the WLIC will hold an Informational Town Hall meeting on Wednesday, April 3 at 7:00 pm at the Embassy Suites Kansas City Airport. The topics to be discussed at the meeting are:

- Proposed fee increases
- Proposed dock options near the property at 10208 NW 73rd Terr

After the meeting, a poll will be conducted on both issues via email (paper poll will be available at the WLIC office, if preferred). The WLIC will then communicate the results of the poll after consideration by its Bord of Directors.

Space & Dock Inspections: Permits and Block/Lot ID must be installed before May 1st in order to avoid fines during the first round of space and dock inspections. You will need to have paid all outstanding invoices and logged in to the WLIC Member Portal to complete this year's lake use re-education in order to receive your permits (paper forms and emailed links to the course available upon request). If you have not completed these requirements by the end of April and do have watercraft or docks on the lake, we highly encourage you to pick up your bracelets and permits at the office during regular business hours, M-F 8-2. It is unlikely they will get processed at the office and through the mail in order for you to receive them before the deadline.

Lake Season Cleanup: Please volunteer for our Lake Season Cleanup on Saturday, April 20th. If you are available, arrive at the C Point pavilion at 9:00 AM to sign up for a location.

Robin Knotts


Our deepest sympathies and prayers are extended to Don and Jeanie Brockman and family on

FRIENDS OF WEATHERBY LAKE HISTORY



Then people showed up, Rick Footer told me he would take the day off from work and drive with me up to Crystal Lake, Iowa to obtain our boat. He refused to take any money and paid for the gas. We were on the road for thirteen hours. Not once did Rick ever complain.

When we got back that night Jason Cox parked the boat next to his house and promised it would be completely refurbished in the next month.

As I worked on the hill and made some headway over the next few weeks. Justin Kleppner called to tell me he had to get a half cord of wood off his trailer and asked if I would take it. "Of course", I said.

An hour later Justin showed up at Sunset with three of his children. They worked well into the darkness of the night finding wood tossed down the hill by their father and walking it to the wood pile.

The children worked into the cool evening with no jackets on, just the desire to assist me in my endeavors. In the end I lined up team Kleppner and gave them each a gift.

Somehow, I find myself with faith in achieving my endeavors. The boat will sail on April 13th for the Blessing Of the Fleet. We will celebrate the greatness of the lake, the people involved and the kindness of many who have helped me grow on Weatherby Lake.
