From the Editor

THE WORD IS COMPASSION---LEARN IT, USE IT

It's a time when we continue to hear an overload of political and nonpartisan opinions and information that frequently seem skewed or at best, partially factual. Do we just pull in and avoid all of it, or do we try to glean through the headlines to boost our own personal awareness in those areas that might make a difference in the world and our own community? I agree, it can be daunting and consume way too much of our time and energies. However, I do support educating ourselves in important topics that through this enlightenment we can serve the greater good.

A recent moment brought home to me the importance of our responsibility to make at least some effort to learn about those things that could enhance our compassion for others. I have a great affinity to our nation's capitol and have been traveling to Washington, DC several times a year since 1981. Most of those visits have been for personal enjoyment to be with my daughter and family, but occasionally I was able to get into some of those more political related areas that were always rewarding, because I learned valuable information that opened my mind and heart. So, when I turned on TV today, I was immediately drawn to the various presentations made by a number of politicians and guest speakers on a special by C-Span...the House Oversight & Government Reform Committee. Representative Jason Chaffetz is the Director and was moderating a program about cancer research vs cancer treatment. Various citizens gave personal testimony about the need for more research and the need to become more aware of how cancer impacts all of us. Maybe we have not had a cancer diagnosis personally, but we certainly all know someone who has. Rep. Jamie Raskin from Maryland used the analogy that we are all born with two distinct passports....one of good health and one of illness. He pointed out that eventually we will all use both of these passports. But, the point he made was that even if we have not had to



use our illness passport yet, we all still need to be aware and exhibit generous compassion to those who have. Whether it be directed to pediatric, geriatric, or anything in-between, our compassion is dependent on our gaining awareness for the devastation that any illness has on everyone. Certainly, once you hear a serious diagnosis directed at yourself or someone you love, it is an instant game changer.

But, the real point here is to come to an understanding of how someone can be forever changed by a bit of any tough news, not just illness. Vow to be more kind and compassionate to the outside world, and not so self centered that we lose our ability to really care. Compassion needs to be practiced more and with greater sincerity in every aspect of our daily encounters...especially with those we may not know the entire situation. Dear Friends and Neighbors:

March Madness (NCAA Basketball) may be over but Royals baseball is here again and so is the Spring season. Moderate to warm weather continues to be the forecast and the birds, flowers, and trees are loving it. Bluebirds are here now and as I write this newsletter, I am awaiting the return of my friends the orioles and hummingbirds. It is a very exciting time.

I would like to extend good luck wishes to all of the candidates that are running for public office here in Weatherby Lake. The positions of Eastside and Westside Alderman along with the City Judge are up for your consideration. Get to know your candidates so you can make an informed decision on the future of Weatherby Lake. Then, let's all get out the vote on Tuesday, April 4th.

Please mark your calendars for Saturday April 22nd when the City will host the annual shredding of documents at the Community Center front parking lot from 8:00a till noon. You can bring any paper documents that you would like to have shredded and just drop them off. Or, you can stay if you want to visually confirm they were shredded. Also on that day, you can bring any prescription or over-the-counter medicines that you want to discard and the police department will collect and see that they are properly disposed of.

Several residents have asked about repaving our roads in Weatherby Lake. While I agree that it needs to be done, I think it would be prudent to hold off this effort until Kansas City concludes the construction of the two new Waste Water Lift Stations. I am sure these construction projects will bring heavy equipment onto our roads and possibly deteriorate them further. However, we do plan to do our annual road maintenance project but only in the areas where it is most needed. Also, the project to bring Google Fiber to Weatherby Lake is just about concluded. If you have any work in your yard or neighborhood that requires restoration by Google, please be sure to contact them ASAP to ensure the work is completed this spring.

As you may recall, in 2015 my goal was to reduce long term debt in Weatherby Lake. At that time we had a total debt (principal and interest) of \$1,774,406.25 with a maturity date of March 2022. As a result of paying off nearly half a million dollars in principal plus securing a much lower interest rate, we are now approaching the new final payment date of March 2018. This action represents a savings to the taxpayers of Weatherby Lake of \$650,881.25. As your mayor, I plan to continue managing the City's financial resources in a way that will allow us to be "debt free" after that.

Lastly, a few musing thoughts from a poem by Joseph Seamon Cotter entitled "An April Day":

"On such a day as this I think, on such a day as this. When earth and sky and nature's whole are clad in April's bliss; And balmy zephyrs gently waft upon your cheek a kiss; Sufficient is it just to live on such a day as this."

SCAMS

Don't be the victim of a scam. Several scams are being attempted in the area at this time, please be cautious and alert. If you receive a call that a relative is in jail out of town and wants you to send them bond money, check it out because it is probably a scam. If you are asked to receive packages at your home or business and mail them to someone else in another country, be careful, it is probably a scam. If you receive notification you have won a foreign lottery and all you have to do to receive your money is wire or mail a small amount for taxes and fees to claim your prize, it is probably a scam. **No legitimate lottery should ask you for**

money to claim your prize. The IRS does not normally telephone you with a prerecorded message to contact them before they asses a penalty for your taxes. Please call the police if you receive any offers you believe may be a scam. Please be careful of answering YES to unknown callers. Scammers record your answers and then use them to make fraudulent purchases.

SPRING DRIVING

Spring is here and the weather just keeps getting better. More people are out walking, jogging and riding bicycles. The children are waiting for or getting off of their school bus. Please pay attention while driving.

ON STREET PARKING

Parking on city streets is not uncommon in our city. It is sometimes necessary to accommodate guests or when using access areas. Weatherby Lake Ordinance requires that no person shall park any vehicle upon a street in a manner as to leave available less than ten (10) feet of width of the roadway for free movement of vehicular traffic. You may not park in front of a public or private driveway, within thirty (30) feet of an intersection or within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant. The parking laws become even more important with the increased vehicular traffic in the City due to summer lake usage. Improper parking impedes the safe passage of vehicles and limits some property owner's safe use of their driveway. Please observe our parking laws, park in a safe courteous manner and help make Weatherby Lake a safer place to live and drive.

MAIL THEFTS

Several reports of mail being stolen from boxes have been taken recently. Thieves are known to check mail boxes with the outgoing mail flag up or to follow after the mail delivery worker to check incoming mail. If you have outgoing mail, please use the mailbox at the City Hall parking lot or drop it off at another stationary mailbox. If you see anyone you don't recognize checking mailboxes, please call the police immediately.

LOST DOGS

Occasionally the Police Department picks up stray or unlicensed dogs and cats. These animals are kept in the kennels just behind City Hall. We report all lost dogs to the following animal helpers:

If you lose your pet, please call city hall, check with the lost dog registry and check with Pet Connect to help find your pet.



W.L.I.C. Update

Well, spring is here and the WLIC is gearing up for the Lake Season with a variety of projects, events and organizing rain dances to raise the lake level.

Some deadlines, activities and dates to remember include the following:

- WLIC Leaders of the Future: The WLIC will begin a paid internship program this summer for Members' children between the ages 16 23. The program will allow young lake residents to learn about the WLIC and participate in its operations. It will include mentorship to help participants gain an appreciation for common business practices, the planning and operation of the Lake, together with the responsibilities that come with it. The program will begin June 1st and extend through Labor Day. If you have qualified family members who would like to be considered for the program, please contact the WLIC Office. We anticipate having two intern positions for this summer.
- Assessment & Lake Permit Fee Payments were due March 31st. If you haven't paid them, there is a penalty in your future.
- 2017 stickers need to be placed on docks, boats and motors before you use them or before the Space & Dock Committee's May 1st inspections.
- Venita repairs and maintenance on ramps and Access Area resurfacing have been started and should be completed by the time you read this.

- A retention fence is currently being constructed across Rush Creek by the Barry Rd. bridge to catch and prevent logs, trees and other large refuse from entering the North Cove of the Lake.
- A project to construct three check dams on WLIC property on the east side of the road at C Cove to assist in preventing or slowing down silt and other refuse from entering the lake will begin shortly. A Stormwater Management Grant from Platte County has been applied for, to help finance this project.
- The Lake Season Kickoff event at C Point is scheduled for June 11th. Please mark your calendar for this fun family event. More details will be forthcoming next month.
- The WLIC Water Patrol will begin operation May 1st. Water has been turned on at C
 Point and other WLIC Access Areas.
- The WLIC has designated the swim beach, playground and bathrooms at C Point as Non-Smoking Areas. Signs are being posted as a further reminder.

Finally, lets all hope the rains will come soon to raise the level of the Lake.


