

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself to those of you that I have not met. My name is Kevin Davis and I was sworn in on December 1st, 2017 as your new Chief of Police. I began my law enforcement career at the Kansas City Missouri Police Department and later worked for 25 years at the Parkville Missouri Police Department as a patrol Officer, Sergeant and Major. In 2015, I began work at the Weatherby Lake Police Department as a part-time officer. I am honored to be your new Chief of Police and look forward to meeting each of you in the coming days.

I plan on utilizing the Nixle system for emergency and weather notifications and

would encourage you to sign up for Nixle notifications. The Nixle link can be located on the bottom of the City of Weatherby Lake web page http://www.cityofweatherbylake-mo.gov. Click on the Nixle logo to begin sign up for the notifications.

The National Weather Service (NWS) and the State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA) have declared the week of March 5-11, 2018 as Severe Weather Awareness Week for Missouri. The National Weather Service will be providing a local storm spotter class on March 7th, 2018 from 7:00pm-9:00pm at the Park Hill South High School located at 4500 NW River Park Dr. Riverside, MO. 64150.

The Southern Platte Fire Department offers inspection of smoke detectors and will change the smoke detector batteries free of charge if necessary. You must make an appointment with the Southern Platte Fire Department phone number is 816-741-2900.

As a reminder vehicle "City Stickers" were due January 1st, 2018. If you have not purchased your 2018 city sticker please come by city hall during business hours Mon-Fri. 8:00am-2:00pm to obtain one. Do not forget to display your city sticker in the lower left corner (driver's side) of your vehicles front windshield.

Please note the Irish American Club parade will be held on March 17, 2018. Parade line up at 2:00pm on Forest Drive and the parade starts at 3:00pm. A reception will be held following the parade at the Weatherby Lake Community Center located at 8230 N.W. W.L.I.C. Update

As we draft this, we are in between ice and sleet events at the Lake. However, spring is coming and the WLIC is beginning to stir from hibernation. Over the fall and winter, the WLIC has purchased several pieces of property to help protect and enhance the value of our Lake. As you heard at our Annual Meeting in the fall, we purchased and received permission to sell a portion of the property at 8315 NW Westside Dr. We have accepted an offer for the house portion of the property and are in the process of working with the city to replat the property to close this sale.

We have also requested permission from the Court to clean up and maintain the detention pond at Wildwood West that flows under Barry Rd. through the property at 8315 NW Westside Dr. and ultimately into our Lake at O Cove. The brush and garbage around the pond was recently cleaned up. After the detention property has been maintained by the WLIC for a year we will receive title to the property allowing us to better protect the O Cove portion of the Lake. We are also planning to clean up and build a detention pond together with some check dams on our remaining property at 8315 NW Westside Dr.

Don't forget Annual Assessments are due March 31st. These fees must be paid, your Lake Use Permit Form received and Lake Use Education completed before you can get your permits.

Finally, as most of you know, the WLIC purchased the two lots next to the dam at 10208 NW 73rd Terr. to better protect the footings of the dam. The Long Range Planning Committee has been tasked with evaluating various options as to what to do with the house and property going forward and to make recommendations to the Board. The WLIC has conducted open houses for WLIC Members to inspect the property and has prepared and sent a questionnaire to Members to solicit their opinions as to the use of the property. The next meeting of the Long Range Planning Committee is scheduled for 6:00 PM, Tuesday, March 13th at the Weatherby Lake City Hall. All Members are invited to attend.

Also, with the coming of spring the WLIC will be planning for the Lake Season Kickoff. Please hold the date of Sunday, June 3rd for the Kickoff. More information to come. See you when the weather warms up.

Vitriol: Where Is Our Sense of Grace?

Vitriol It is defined as bitter criticism; extreme hatred towards somebody or something; or an expression of this feeling in speech or writing. It is also defined as a sulfate of many metals~~a sulfuric acid, if you will. It all fits together.

You see it, day after day, in interactions between people. If one doesn't receive what they feel they are entitled to, it is perfectly fine to engage in vitriolic behavior. Someone cuts you off in traffic. Someone does not value your opinion or feel the way that you do. Someone doesn't cook your burger just the way that you wanted it. Someone doesn't say something...or they do...

Conversations evolve, without regard to the hurtfulness that might be caused to others. Someone insists that their statements be heard, no matter the cost. We have seen it in politics and religion and it seems to be intensifying every day. We saw it when Presidents Lincoln and Kennedy were assassinated. 9/11. We've seen it when nations have gone to war. It is sometimes confused with freedom of expression.

In reality, vitriol is often an act of cowardice. Years ago, Harry Chapin wrote a song called, "Sniper." It told the story of the young man who climbed the bell tower at the University of Texas, and opened fire, killing several people. He looked for his shadow. and nothing was there. He would make himself significant in his own mind.

There is room in our country for educated dialogue. Dialogue with respect and absent hateful rhetoric. Dialogue with differences that cause us to redefine our beliefs or to affirm them with an even stronger foundation. It is part of the learning and growing process. It is not all about politics, religion, and greed. It's about how we treat people day to day. It is what Dr. Ernie Boyer termed a "commitment to character." While it is easy to speculate on what causes vitriolic causes incidents such as these, no one knows for sure. What we do know for sure is that we, as a society, need to regard one another with grace on a day to day basis. That would set the example for generations yet to come. And it all must start somewhere. Somewhere, such as in situations where we might find ourselves today or tomorrow.

Wouldn't it be something if we aligned ourselves with Dr. Boyer's commitment to character in a way that might snuff out the corrosive effect of vitriol? We don't want it on our automotive battery cables. Perhaps we should endeavor to keep it out of our hearts. And replace it with Amazing Grace...how sweet the sound...


