LIFE AND DEATH

Is it just me, or do you feel like we have lost an extraordinary number of good friends this past winter? I have lost count of the number of funerals I have attended. A friend mentioned to me recently that she was a bit overcome with a sense of deep loss...having difficulty accepting the foreverness of her loss. The deeper our caring is for a person, the more difficult it is to accept that loss as we painfully learn to move on without them. Life is a mystery...death is even more mysterious...even when we have certain beliefs in what happens after death. I have lost countless loved ones...parents, grandparents, spouse, best friends...and it doesn't get any easier. It seems to become even more difficult to recover and get on with the bit of life left. So many things left to do, so many experiences to have, so many opportunities to be caring, kind, and loving...so many ways to be the best one can

So, we continue to sort through the maze and make the best choices we know how today, knowing that there will be crossroads where the best path isn't as clear as what we think we need. I have had the great fortune to live in several different homes around the lake and have enjoyed living on both the East side and the West side.

I would like to thank you for your support and welcome you to join us each month on the second Wednesday at City Hall at 7:00 p.m. My hope is to keep the meeting to approximately 45 minutes.

I plan on resurrecting something that we as a Board were doing 18 years ago when I first started as an Eastside Alderman. That is that each alderman has a collateral duty for a different area or department within our City. After talking with each of the aldermen we have agreed to the following:

- Alderman Richmond, Westside Alderman, who is Mayor Pro Tem will work with Chief Davis and the Police Department.
- Alderman Hoy, Westside Alderman, will work with Mr. Lowman and the Public Works Department.
- Alderman Footer, Eastside Alderman, will work with the office staff.
 These duties will include the financials and methods of communication, i.e. the City's website.
- Alderman Finn, Eastside Alderman, will work on Community
 Engagement and special projects. These duties will include 4th of July
 events, shredding event, liaison with WLIC and the Community Center.

By resurrecting these collateral duties, I hope to fully engage our aldermen in the workings of our City.

Our assistant City/Court Clerk, Nan Jones is retired at the end of April. We are in the process of looking for her replacement. When this new person is hired, we are looking at keeping the City office open on Mondays until 5 p.m. addressing resident concerns.

Chief Davis is looking for one more full time officer to have the Police Department fully staffed.

It is my very strong belief that we need to maintain full 24 hour a day coverage.

We are in the process of setting a date for us as a Board, to review the status of our 2018 budget and budget process.

Finally, I want to start a long range planning committee to figure out how we are going to solve some ongoing problems. For example, the traffic issues we have on Eastside Drive, Roberts Road, Potomac Avenue and the intersection of Eastside, Barry Rd and Amity. I foresee this as a temporary group of residents that can get together and formulate plans to solve problems like this and in other areas.

Again, thank you for your support and I look forward to serving you and our City.

The Lake Season is almost upon us although its hard to tell it by the weather we have been having lately. We are becoming busy the following past and future activities:

- Lake Season Kick Off will be 3:00 PM 10:00 PM on June 3rd.

Join the Lake Storm Buster Volunteers!

As most of you are aware, when we have severe storms and heavy rains, the lake can receive rubbish, logs and branches flowing into the Lake from outside sources which can damage member property. These events require volunteer clean up on an as needed basis. To secure resources to help with these events the WLIC is assembling a list of volunteers willing to be on call for these activities. Following one of these events the WLIC will contact these volunteers to assemble the Lake Storm Buster clean-up crew. This group will be called the "Lake Storm Chasers" and will be given a T-shirt designating them as a Member of this team. Please contact the WLIC Office if you can volunteer for this "prestigious" group.

Important Note – Watercraft and Dock Permit Stickers should be displayed by today, May 1st. Space & Dock Volunteers are beginning inspections now and violations will be notified and fined.

The Lake Season Kick Off will be held at C Point and include

games and activities for the entire family, a cookout meal and beverages and entertainment by the "9.9ers" band. Activities will include a Lake Safety Game, a Youth Fishing Clinic, presentations by Lake Organizations and other games and prizes to be announced.

In other news, the WLIC Water Patrol boat has been launched. Patrols will also begin today, May 1st, and include weekends and selected days and times during the week. The Water Patrol phone number is 816-807-6700. Please keep it handy! The WLIC urges all Members to practice safe boating and swimming practices. Please be courteous during all lake activities. As a reminder, the C Point swim beach and playground areas have been designated as Non-Smoking. Please observe this designation when in these areas.

The current C Point cedar playground equipment will be removed and replaced with a new more extensive set of playground equipment donated by the Adam Tholen Family. Please be careful at C Point during the transition.

New sand has been added to the C Point beach. Please help us maintain the beach area by not moving sand from the beach area and keeping it as clean as possible.

Water testing for E. coli and other hazardous chemicals will also begin this month. A new lake closing communication method will be used this season. If you see a green flag at C Point, the entire lake is open for swimming. If it is yellow, a portion of the lake is closed for swimming and you should check www.wlic.org for updates. If it is red, the entire lake is closed for swimming.

The WLIC is working with the Southern Platte Fire Protection District, the Weatherby Lake Police Department, the Weatherby Lake Fire Protection Board, the Southern Platte County Ambulance District and the City of Weatherby Lake to develop a Water/Ice Emergency Field Operating Guide detailing emergency rescue and recovery responsibilities for the lake. You will be receiving more information on this process later this summer.
