Mayor's Comments

Hello from City Hall,

All too soon another boating and swim season has come and gone again. The weather mostly cooperated for another great year of lake enjoyment. Once again it's time to think about winterizing watercraft and preparing for autumn and winter around the house.

As many of you are by now aware, a couple of unauthorized non-members launched their boat from a private boat ramp on the west side of the lake and were quickly discovered by the WLIC Water Patrol. Our Weatherby Police were called and arrived at the scene about the time the boat was pulled out onto the trespassers' boat trailer. This is where the controversy began. Obviously 'The City' can only enforce situations like this 'legally', meaning in a Missouri State-authorized, legal manner.

Immediately WLIC representatives requested that our police 'impound' the boat and trailer and arrest the trespassers. The responding officer advised that we, 'The City', were unable to legally impound the boat and trailer but the trespassers were each issued a ticket. That decision was verified up the Police Departments' chain of command up to, and including our City Attorney. As a WLIC member myself, I also was frustrated to learn this but 'The City' can't break the law to enforce our rules.

Like every other WLIC member, I complete the annual training about Zebra Mussels and am concerned about keeping this invasive species out of our beautiful lake. Our Police Department is very knowledgeable of our laws but there is only so much we can legally do. Our two WLIC access areas now have cables across them because of a similar incident many years ago. As you may or may not know there are a very few private lakefront homes that own a concrete boat ramp and it was from one of those properties where this boat was launched...the ramp had a 'No Trespassing' sign barrier, but it was on the ground. It is not clear who or when it was removed.

I am not throwing shade by any means on my counterparts at WLIC and consider our two entities to be 'co-partners' in this endeavor we call 'Weatherby Lake'. Our City Municipal Judge found the two trespassers guilty, imposed a 90-day suspended sentence, with probation to include staying off of WLIC property for 2 years, and both were fined to the maximum allowed by law of \$500 each. It's my hope going forward this is the last time we all have to deal with this issue.

A fall City Wide Clean-up is scheduled for the first weekend of November; the 3rd 4th and 5th, Friday thru Sunday, for Weatherby residents only. We will only accept yard waste - behind City Hall as usual.

On a personal note, I just had my fireplace inspected and it had a clean bill of health. I've had two chimney fires in my lifetime and 'no', neither structure burned down, but the flues needed to be repaired afterwards. It was both a scary and expensive event. If you burn your fireplace in the winter, I recommend you have it checked yearly as I do.

Enjoy the cooler fall weather and GO CHIEFS!

The Weatherby Lake Police Department will be participating in the 29th Annual, "Shop with a Cop/Deputy" event sponsored by the Platte County Sheriff's Office on December 2nd, 2023, at the Barry Road Walmart. The Weatherby Lake Police Department will be accepting cash or check donations to fund the holiday shopping for underprivileged children that reside in Platte County. In 2022, with contributions from the WL Irish American Club, WOW, residents and city staff, \$4,450.00 was raised for the worthy cause!!

The police department routinely receives calls on noise complaints. Often these callers decline to complete a written statement form and/or testify in municipal court. If the responding officer arrives at the call location and does not hear the noise in-person no further legal action can be taken. Section 210.239 Noise-Making When Loud, Unnecessary, Etc. reads in part:

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue or cause to be made or continued any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others within the City.

B: The following acts, among others, are declared to be loud, disturbing and unnecessary noises in violation of this Section, but such enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive.

B2: The using, operating or permitting to be played, used or operated of any radio receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph or other machine or device for the producing or reproducing of sound in such manner as to disturb the peace, quiet and comfort of the neighboring inhabitants, including but not limited to residential neighbors and person, on the lake, or at any time with louder volume than is necessary. The operation of any such set, instrument, phonograph, machine or device between the hours of 11:00 P.M. and 7:00 A.M. in such a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of hundred (100) feet from the building, structure, watercraft or vehicle.

Members of WLPD are looking forward to participating in the October 31, 2023, "Trunk or Treat" event at C-Point.



Like a distant island that slowly comes into view, so was the beautiful day of sailing that finally came into focus. Blue skies, perfect temperature, and a constant, cool breeze.

I strolled down to the boat early in the morning, took my time taking off the cover and draining any water that lay below. The boat was perfect, and I felt like I was working on a champion thoroughbred ready to stretch its legs cut through the water with relentless precision. Today was the day to win.

The rest of the boat preparation was quick and without a hitch. About a half hour before the gun, we cast off for the starting line. Kim was at the helm, I manned the mainsheet, and our neighbor worked the foredeck.

The first mark found us in second place, we raised the spinnaker and raced down to the dam. Rounding the mark, we stowed the spinnaker and headed back up to the D mark. At times I would look back at Kim in pure joy, relaxing and taking the boat as far into the wind while maintaining speed. She pointed higher than any other boat on the lake. The boat and her were in their element as if wrapped in a thick blanket of nature at its best. I was so proud of all of it.

By the time we reached the windward mark we were on the lead boat messing with its wind as we brought up the spinnaker for the second and final leg. The lead boat hesitated for a second getting caught in poor wind and we saw our chance. Kim stayed wide of the poor air, and we pulled into first place. Alleluia the saints are with us today!

The wind started to blast in from the west and what was a run soon became a reach. Fred pulled the spinnaker to the leeward side, now having the main jib and spinnaker giving us a galloping stride. 80 more yards to the mark and we would round it for the finish line. All looked perfect.

Then somewhere between a loud snap and an explosive boom something terrible happened. I looked up to see the inner stroud of the rigging on the windward side hanging in mid-air. We now had a good chance of blowing out the mast and causing a complete failure. Immediately I yelled at Kim to pull up to the wind. Fred and I doused the spinnaker. The three of us looked at each other in complete shock. The rigging dangled like a broken leg on a thoroughbred. I felt like something in me broke inside, snapped like the rigging as we watched the fleet pass by us to the mark.

We carefully sailed home using the other side rigging and limped on to the lift. We had failed. We pushed the boat too hard. She gave us all she had. We pushed her harder. There are no lessons, just mending the boat and heart. As I walked away from the boat that night I paused and looked back down on her to thank her and the lake for being alive. Right now!
