From the Editor

Like most folks, I have my favorite people...some are close, and some not so much. Everyone manages those inner circles in different ways...some by being dedicated to the time committed to those special people...others by intending to set aside more time for those important people but do not follow thru. my own toast, and there was no bowl of fresh blueberries left on the counter for me. I was amused with how quickly I had adapted to the great caring from loved ones. And, even though I have spent my entire life with the same zip code, I recognized that we are adjustable by nature, and with love we find meaning...even with a pandemic.

My son from Boulder, was on my doorstep within 48 hours to attend the Chief's playoffs. Arrowhead was appropriately distanced with fans, but I declined, nevertheless. Home is now back to calm, but the renewed family closeness provided an abundance of familiar caring warmth that was overdue. Hoping it will sustain me while we slog through another season or more of this horrible pandemic.

When the personal touch of family is limited, we look to our special friends and favorite people. We have them close by in our community. Weatherby Lake is a mix of amazing giving, kind and caring individuals. Mayor's Comments

Winter Greetings from City Hall

Raise your hand if you are happy to say goodbye to 2020! It was certainly a year for the books. I keep reminding myself that we cannot change what has happened; we can only control how we react to it and what we do in the future. I think it's safe to say that the world is ready to get back to some semblance of normal, so let's look to 2021 with optimism, realism, and hope. Cheers to 2021!

We at City Hall remain vigilant in regards to the Covid-19 virus. A few employees have come down with it but thru the grace of God all have returned to health and work. So far we have been fortunate with the mild winter weather. Public Works Director George Lowman and his crew are always at the ready to quickly and efficiently respond when the snow and freezing rain begin to fall.

Be assured that your City runs a very tight financial ship. We have five full time Public Works employees that are on-call 24 hours a day. Our 24 hour Police Department has five full time Officers, a reserve force of eleven. Our office staff consists of three parti-time Clerks and a part-time Treasurer. Weatherby Lake is one of the few city's in Platte County that continues to maintain a Municipal Court. The Public Works department has 5 vehicles in it's fleet and we have 4 Police Cruisers and a bicycle. While our City has a nearly \$3 million budget your 4 Aldermen and myself strive to get the most for your dollars. We finished 2020 with a surplus of over \$138,000.

Public Works recently completed the Emergency Water connection with Water District 6 whose tower sits across from City Hall. This is important for both entities because if either one of our water sources is interrupted a valve can be turned to tap into the other's source. This project came in \$30,000 under budget with the guidance of Alderman Doug Richmond and Public Works Director Lowman.

The City applied to Platte County for \$31,000 of Federal Cares funds to recoup expenditures because of the Pandemic. The big ticket item that we applied for but hadn't purchased was an audio/visual system for City Hall. Unfortunately the County Commission denied that and other expenditures that we had already made. We received \$6,489 instead.

There will be a City election on April 6th this year. Two Eastside Residents have filed for Alderman, Russ Monuski and Tyler Patterson. Mayor Pro Tem Doug Richmond has filed for Westside Alderman and is unopposed.

Let's all cheer for the Chief's for another Super Bowl victory! Here's to more mild winter weather and an early spring!




ST. PAT'S PARADE ROUTE
