Mayor's Comments

Greetings from City Hall,

Preparations are starting for the cold winter weather City wide. Our salt bins are now full and our public works trucks and plows are being readied for the inevitable snow and ice we always get. I understand the Farmer's Almanac has predicted above average snow and cold. This is the very reason winter is not my favorite season here in the Midwest.

As I write this article, a Republic Services recycle truck had a previously unknown hydraulic leak all over our streets in multiple locations. I quickly became aware of it when I went out to bring my bin back to the house. I immediately took pictures of it and sent it on to the Republic regional manager along with the demand that this be immediately cleaned up as per our contract. This has been an ongoing issue that caused us to have our City attorney send them a letter very recently; they can expect we will begin fining them monetarily as per our contract.

I was in personal contact with this manager throughout the day as I directed Chief Davis to find this recycle truck and direct him off of our streets. By the time this happened he had completed his route on the Eastside and was just starting to service the Westside. By late afternoon the cleanup provider was on the job and attempting to attend to all of the spills. I personally chatted with the owner of the provider and exchanged business cards with him. I am putting Republic on notice that in the future for faster action on cleanup, I will be calling this guy directly.

What I want to stress to all is that your City is hyper vigilant on pollution and expect all providers to be responsible and clean up after themselves. Our community and lake depend on all of us doing the 'right thing' and the City will go the extra mile to assure that this is accomplished.

As many of you may know, I have been in the process of building my third (and last) home here in Weatherby. The first two homes with my previous wife were both on the Eastside on 78th Street and 73rd Terrace. Since our divorce I've been living on the Westside on 82nd Terrace for the last 16 years. All of this moving around has been going on since we moved into our first home in March of 1988, 34 years ago when I was a young guy. I'm engaged now (no date set) to Deb a recent transplant from 'the other lake' – Lake Waukomis. Now I'm back on the Eastside, 73rd Street with Deb and this time it's a log cabin. Right now I'm not so sure that I would recommend building one.



WLIC Update

To WLIC Members and Residents:

Affinis Corporation has been engaged to conduct another lake bottom survey to assess the build-up of silt on specific areas of the lake to ascertain the timing of a dredge of the lake in future years. When the survey is completed, the results will be communicated to the WLIC membership.

- The bi-annual inspection of the Dam has been successfully completed .
- Progress on planning for the future of the 10208 NW 73rd Terr. (Pease) property has been slowed by Covid and related delays on in material procurement for various projects related to this property.
- The following is a current status of various WLIC projects:
- A 7-10 year Long-Range financial plan is underway. It will be reviewed by the Financial Committee, Long Range Planning Committee and the Board upon its completion.
- A number of docks will be installed at the property. This project has been delayed due to delivery of required materials as well as further engineering analysis.
- The construction of a 16-space parking lot across the street from this property will begin in late 2022, weather permitting.
- We are working to construct a 40 x 40 utility garage below the dam to house WLIC equipment currently stored at various places in and around the community.

Lastly, Thank you to the Credentials & Elections Committee for their help at the Annual Membership Meeting. Long-standing Chairperson Tanya

Finn and her team of volunteers continues to ensure our election processes are accurate and efficient.

Heartfelt condolences are extended to Pete Walker and family on their recent loss of Patty Walker. Patty and Pete have lived at Weatherby Lake for many years. They



FRIENDS OF WEATHERBY LAKE HISTORY





Kids fishing clinic \$2,000 to the Fishing Club to offset the cost of the new rods, reels, tackle, and bait that they give freely to all kids who attend the instructional clinic.

An average of 70 kids, ages 2 to 16, participate in the clinic annually.
