

Mayor's Comments

Hello to Spring!

Well we survived another winter, which wasn't really that bad overall. The worst of cold and snow happened all at once about a month ago. Public Works used approximately 250 tons of salt this winter and we still have over 100 tons if we need more. It makes me appreciate the fact that I don't live any further north of our beloved Weatherby Lake.

Tuesday, April 6th is election day at the Community Center from 6AM until 7PM. There are Alderman positions from both East and West sides, our Municipal Judge and candidates for Park Hill School Board on the ballot. Educate yourselves on all the candidates and exercise your precious right to vote.

The weekend of April 16th – 18th the City is having our annual Spring Cleanup. Weatherby residents that have only yard waste can take it to the lot behind City Hall. Look for directional signs with the times thru Sunday April 18th.

On Saturday April 17th at the Community Center we are having our annual Shredding Event, Drug Take Back and Electronics disposal. Alderman Tanya Finn has coordinated this for many years and she again asks for a generous donation of canned goods from all participants. Check elsewhere in this Newsletter for times. I also understand that the WLIC is having an access area clean up that day as well.

Very soon we will be paving Hillside Drive to Wayland Drive over to Potomac. Public Works Director Lowman has a multiyear plan for paving and has determined that this project will cost approximately \$100,000. Your City has a positive balance being held by the County and this project will draw from these reserves. This account is fed by County Sales Tax revenue.

We have been advised by our water provider, Kansas City, MO that we will not have a water rate increase this year or next. So water rates will be held steady for 3 years in a row which is the first time I can recall this happening. However we have been notified by KCMO that the sewer rates will be increased by 5%.

April-May are spring severe weather months, be sure to sign up for Nixle notifications. The Nixle icon is located on the front of the city web page. You can receive the notifications by text, email or both text and email.



Nearly on a daily basis the department receives complaints from residents regarding receiving fraudulent/scam phone calls and e-mails, both on their home phone, cellular phones and computer(s)/smart devices. Unfortunately this practice is growing day by day. As technology has developed so has the availability to alter incoming phone numbers on caller I.D. to make the recipient believe the call is from a local or U.S. phone number. These phone or e-mail "scams" can falsely represent government institutions and private industry from the FBI, IRS, Social Security Administration and banking services. All of these scam calls or e-mails have one thing in common, that is to <u>exploit</u> <u>funds</u> or <u>your identity</u> from you. I urge everyone to be cautious of these scams and to be aware of all information you provide over the phone or via computer. If you believe you are a victim of a phone or online scam, you can file an online complaint with the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center at: <u>https://www.ic3.gov</u>.

The department continues to receive complaints of incoming and outgoing mail being tampered with in private residence mailboxes. I would suggest all outgoing mail be dropped off at an "official" U.S. Post Office mailbox location. Securable private mailboxes are available for purchase on-line and at area home improvement stores.

As a reminder vehicle "City Stickers" were due March 1st, 2021. If you have not purchased your 2021 city sticker(s) please come by city hall during business hours Mon-Fri. 8:00am-4:00pm. Do not forget to display your city sticker in the lower left corner (driver's side) of your vehicles front windshield.

Exciting news from your WLHC

Starting this spring, we're beginning Phase One of an Oral History Project for our community. Our goal is to enrich our understanding of the Weatherby Lake Experience as seen through the eyes of those who have lived here for many years (beginning with 40 or more years). We hope to discover stories that have not been told in The Chronicles that represent many different perspectives from within our community. WLIC Update

Spring is here and the WLIC is busy getting the lake ready for summer. The C-Point Pavilion and restrooms will be opened Thursday, April 1, 2021. Water will also be turned on at the other access areas on April 1st. At all WLIC access areas, the Platte County Health Department Covid regulations will be applied again this year and can be found on their website at: <u>https://</u>www.plattecountyhealthdept.com/emergency.aspx.

In coordination with the city wide clean-up and shredding events, the WLIC lake clean-up will be held on Saturday, April 17th from 9am until noon. Volunteers should plan to meet at C-Point at 9:00 AM to coordinate our efforts. Volunteers should wear appropriate clothing and gloves. Please bring outdoor tools like rakes, clippers and pick-up tools. WLIC will provide lawn bags, bottled water, cleaning supplies and a few lawn pick-up tools. Any volunteers who have their boats on the lake should meet at C-Point to coordinate their assignments and tasks. If you are not able to help at this time, let us know and we can coordinate other times and tasks to get our lake ready for the season.

WLIC has started issuing boat, motor, dock, watercraft and nonresident permits as well as bright orange member identification bracelets for members and their families once all fees have been paid and the lake safety boating education course has been completed by all family members over 14 years of age in households with registered watercraft. While the WLIC personnel are mailing these permits as quickly as possible, please be patient if there is a lag in receiving of permits and bracelets If you do not receive your 2021 permit by the time you wish to use the lake, we will honor your 2020 permits and wrist bands. Also, due to issues caused by pandemic conditions, the WLIC is not charging late fees and penalties before May 1, 2021.

The WLIC is continuing our office internship program during the summer. Our 2021 intern is Seth Casas, a college junior who lives with his parents here at the lake. If you call the WLIC phone number and Seth answers the phone, please take a minute to introduce yourself.

So as we get started with this lake season, let's all enjoy our wonderful lake and have a safe and fun summer!


WEATHERBY LAKE FISHING CLUB ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP


