From the Editor

"HARD LESSONS"

There are uncountable lessons to be learned in life, many of them can be hard lessons, but they are lessons nevertheless. Change is one of those hard lessons. And, boy, have I seen a lot of that here at Weatherby Lake during multiple decades. I was barely out of my teens when I first moved here. There were just a handful of residents and we all pretty much knew one another...Eastside & Westside, and everyone in between. We came together and made a difference (over half a century before the WLIC coined "Together We Make A Difference"). Everyone truly contributed...it was just the way we did things. We didn't see it as an imposition or a bother. It was like doing the dishes after dinner as a kid...a true family all worked and played together. And, for the last 85 years, folks at Weatherby have been doing their part to make our community what it is today...truly amazing.

Many of those great people who did their part are no longer here. But, the foundation that they left remains. That foundation is made up of example and encouragement. Good, generous, hard working people contributed in significant ways to create and support our community. That example was hand carried like a relay runner's baton. How does one rekindle that fire of giving? How does that awareness that everyone has a responsibility to do their part, become a part of today's community heartbeat? The very least we owe our community is our respect...to maintain integrity as we benefit from so much more than we have given.

Mayor's Comments

Again we find ourselves in the dog days of summer, which means to me that sooner than later I have to begin to think about winterizing the boat and again begin preparations for colder weather. Fall is just ok but spring and summer are the best for me and my lake life.

Alderman Russ Monuski recently posted on the Weatherby Lake Face book page; with his permission here are some important items that he brought forward. We recently updated our City website which hopefully will make it easier to use and navigate and now everyone has the ability to sign up for online payments for water and sewer bills and also get Weatherby Lake news, forms, online residence checks and more! Cityof-Weatherbylake-mo.gov

Also thanks to Russ, the US Postal Service collection box in front of City Hall was finally recently updated after 20 some years of requesting. Now we have a more convenient drive up mail slot to make things easier for our residents. So no more of getting out of your car to deposit mail!

In the past few weeks our Public Works Department contracted to have new reflective lines along sharp turns and curved roads throughout the lake to make it easier for our residents to see at night and much safer too. Also because of multiple requests by the local residents in the area of Eastside Drive and 79th ST, we have painted crosswalk hashes on the street. There will also be flashing lights to warn of this pedestrian crossing. We hope this will slow down the thru traffic that picks up speed from the hills to the north and south. What you may not know is there are nearly 17,000 vehicles that travel that road every week and many are not obeying the 25 MPH speed limit, as we are all aware.

As I write this article today, a North Kansas City police officer was killed in an execution style murder for doing his job stopping a motorist just for expired license plates. Sometimes we take our Weatherby Police officers for granted and complain because we aren't doing enough to stop all these speeders on Eastside Drive, for example. Our Police Department is a 24 hour a day operation and we have 2 full time vacancies. Chief Davis is doing everything he can to fill these spots but the candidates that we have had apply are not quality individuals. We are stretched very thin but persevering.

Police work is a very dangerous job. A few years ago our officer found a vehicle with out of state plates sitting on the street at the top of the hill going down to C-Point. After checking the plates, he discovered that it belonged to an escaped felon and was considered armed and dangerous. Our officer requested back up and the felon was arrested. He had a loaded handgun under the seat of his vehicle and commented on Face book that he would not be taken alive.

A former coworker of mine at United Airlines is now the Mayor of North Kansas City. I saw him, my friend on TV to report on the death of his officer. He did an excellent job, controlling his emotions probably a lot better than I could have. At this point I have a personal relationship with all of our employees as Bryant probably does as well. It's my daily prayer to the Good Lord to keep them all safe and out of harm's way. The very last thing I want to do is be 'that' mayor going before camera's announcing some type of tragedy at Weatherby Lake as we have seen countless times lately.

I'm asking that everyone be patient and obey our laws even when you know 'no one is looking'. Many from outside our community travel thru as a 'cut thru' and don't obey our laws; some are not 'good people'. Many new homes are in the plans on Barry Road and many more are likely to come.

Be safe, be kind and have a great rest of your 'Lake Season'!

In the past weeks the Police Department has been notified that many non-commercial personally owned automobiles housed/operated within the city are not displaying a current Weatherby Lake City license. City ordinance 385.150 reads in part:

It shall be unlawful for any person who is a resident of Weatherby Lake to operate a motor vehicle in the City of Weatherby Lake without displaying a valid City license in the lower left corner (driver's side) of the windshield.

City vehicle licenses are available at city hall Monday-Friday 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.

In recent days many person(s) under the age of 18 have been contacted riding stand-up skate boards/coasters either self-propelled or powered by electricity on the roadways. These types of skate boards/coasters are not approved to be operated on any city street at any time. Often these con-


Meet your neighbor and learn their names.
