When Hank and Ginny moved to Weatherby Lake in 2003, the integrity and quality of life for Weatherby Lake took a big step forward.

Hank is well known for his tireless efforts collecting and restoring old boats, trailers, watercraft of any kind, cars, etc. and donating the profits back to our community in the form of educational scholarships for our resident students. (In the last 10 years, 145 students have received \$500 scholarships.)

Hank isn't just the President of the Fishing Club...he is a man who turns that position into an opportunity to volunteer countless hours for the betterment of our community. The Kid's Fishing Clinic provides free fishing equipment, rods & reels, bait and lessons each year to nearly 100 of our youth (91 in 2023).

If someone needs help, Hank shows up...not for the recognition, but because it's the thing to do...no bragging. He helps others with their boat launchings...in and out of the water, dock repairs, and anything he can assist with. He helps organize the Christmas tree fish habitat program and the fish stocking every year. The Family Picnic provides free food and drink to our entire community and the Fish Fry's are a popular community gathering.

Mayor's Comments

Mid-summer greetings from your City Hall.

It's that time of year when I find myself realizing that it's August again and I haven't had my full share of 'lake life'. Get out and grab all you can get while the weather is favorable.

We had another awesome 4th of July this year. The day started with the usual 4th of July parade throughout the city with Hank Nussbeck as the Grand Marshall. That was followed by the patriotic Flag raising ceremony at Birmingham Park lead by SAV President Pat Botbyl. My continued thanks to our own 'Ms Firecracker', Tanya Finn for being the 'fire' behind our yearly celebration! By the way, as of this writing we are about \$5,000 short of our goal which will negatively impact next years' fireworks display. If you haven't already, leave your donation at City Hall.

Recently many citizens have become motivated to find out just what it is that 'The City' is doing. I'd like to share that we are always available to answer a wide variety of questions that you might have through various methods. Through our recently updated website it is possible to ask general questions to specific staff or elected officials individually. All aldermen and myself can be addressed individually through the website. Additionally the monthly City Board of Aldermen meeting is always held on the second Wednesday of every month at City Hall at 7PM. I take questions from the attendees in person and via Zoom early in the meetings. I am also available for an in-person chat most days of the week with an appointment. Our City website was updated to be as user friendly as we could make it.

Soon school will be starting and children will be waiting for their school buses in the mornings and being dropped off mid afternoons. The parents of these children appreciate your patience while following a bus and waiting as the bus is loading and unloading their precious 'cargo'. In the recent past we have had instances of impatient folks not heeding a bus's stop sign. Please be considerate of the children and obey the law.

The issue I have probably spent more of my time on as mayor is 'The Barry Road and Eastside Drive Problem'. Keep in mind that the entire intersection lies with the City of Kansas City, Missouri. The local KCMO Councilman and his assistant over the past 5 years have become regular phone friends of mine. There is only so much cajoling that I can do to get another city to help us here at Weatherby. We have added signage on our side of the intersection and I have been successful in getting better signage on Amity warning vehicles that there is a stop sign ahead on Barry Rd. Yearly I have to call 311 which is a KCMO hotline to mow grass on the north side of the intersection. In the winter our own Public Works plows snow from the intersection and treats it with salt.

Barry Road was recently repaved and the newly repainted markings were not done sufficiently for safe travel for our residents. With a very well written letter to the lead KCMO traffic engineer by NW Forest Drive resident Lainey Puglisi and follow up encouragement from me, we met at Barry Rd and Forest Drive one morning with that engineer and his two assistants along with Alderman Stuhlman. The engineers were very agreeable to our concerns and before they left assured us that they would make some changes which ended up being well more than I expected. My thanks to Ms Puglisi for a very heartfelt appeal that bore fruit for us all. Enjoy the remainder of your summer boating season!

Each day WLPD receives complaints from citizens of robo-calls, scam calls or calls received from an unknown caller. Citizens also complain of unwanted or unsolicited text messages from an unknown sender. You should never answer ANY call you do not recognize. If the caller is legitimate they will leave a message and number for you to call back. If you receive a text message from someone you do not know DO NOT reply to the text. You should erase the message and block the sender. The Federal Trade Commission maintains a national website to report unwanted calls at <https://www.donotcall.gov/report.html>.

Several summer storms have produced severe weather including high winds, hail which resulted in tree damage and local power outages. For weather and city-related notifications, sign up for Nixle notifications on the front of the city web page under featured links (get Nixle alerts). You can receive the notifications by text, email or both text and email.



If you have access to the internet, the residence check form is available online located at the city web page <http://www.cityofweatherbylake-mo.gov> under Featured Links > Online Residence Check.

As a reminder, the annual Jeremy Katzenberger Memorial Triathlon will be held on Sunday August 27th, 2023. The participants will be competing on several city streets so I urge all motorists to use caution during this event. You can find more information about this event at: <https://jktri.weebly.com/>.

During the spring and summer months many residents operate motorized bicycles/mopeds on the city streets. The following Weatherby Lake ordinance reads in part:

Section 380.070 Motorized Bicycles — License Required.

A. No person shall operate a motorized Bicycle on any highways, streets or roads in this City unless the person has a valid license to operate a motor vehicle.

B. No motorized bicycle may be operated on any public thoroughfare located within this City which has been designated as part of the Federal interstate highway system.

Section 380.080 Equipment Required.

No person shall operate a motorized bicycle on any highways, streets or roads in this City unless it is equipped in accordance with the minimum requirements for construction and equipment of MOPEDS, Regulation VESC-17, approved July, 1977, as promulgated by the Vehicle Equipment Safety Commission.

As electric stand up scooters and electric motorcycles become more prevalent the city is working on updating the city ordinances to address these modes of transportation.

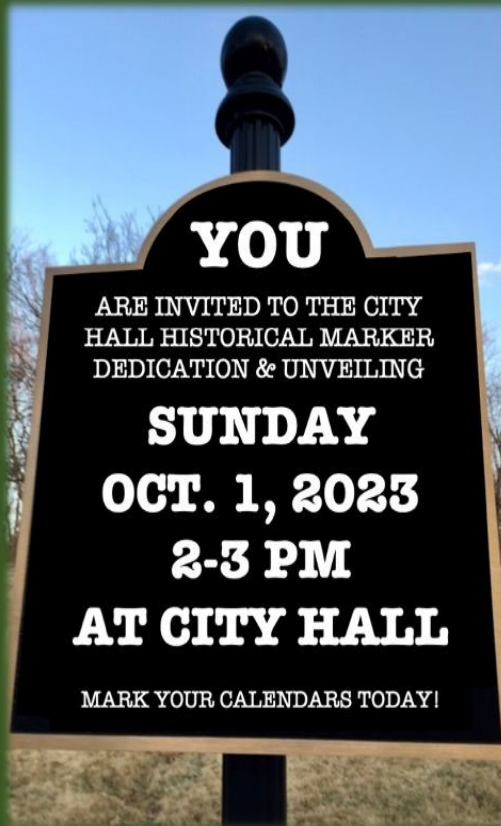

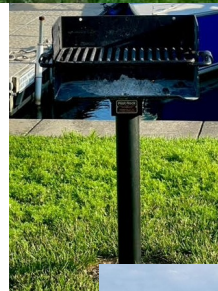
WLIC Update

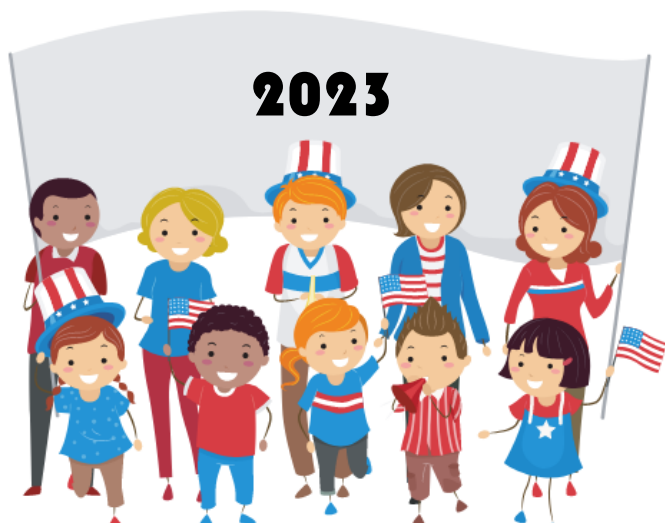
You may have seen some decals on some trash cans around the lake “KEEP KIDS ALIVE DRIVE 25.”
