Mayors Comments

Winter greetings from City Hall.

Chief Davis, Emergency Management Director Voorhies and I recently attended an area police chiefs meeting at the KCMO North Patrol Headquarters. It was an active give and take with local law enforcement concerns of all the cities in Platte and Clay County. Major Huth of KCMO Police hosted the event. Both Counties sent representatives.

We let the Major know that the intersection of Eastside Drive/Amity and Barry Road is very hazardous due to speeding through that intersection westbound down the hill from Zona Rosa. We mentioned that since this is not in our city limits, KCMO police needs to step up enforcement, not just here, but also eastbound coming from the Grass Pad towards both Westside Drive and Potomac. Major Huth was very agreeable to step up enforcement and the Platte County Sheriff's department said they would as well.

The KCMO commander of the Shoal Creek Headquarters was also in attendance and mentioned that citizens calling the Kansas City 311 hotline is VERY effective as well. After the meeting we learned that enough Riverside residents called this 311 number that it caused KCMO to install 2 roundabouts in the Briar Cliff area! The take away is there will be speed traps in this area....be warned and watch your speed limit. Secondly if you see dangerous behavior in the areas I have mentioned, call 311. Please pass this information on and call 311 every time you observe dangerous vehicular behavior.

Your city is in need of a local volunteer to head up our participation in the 2020 Census. This a very important job that determines our local and national representation, including tax revenue we receive and many other policy decisions that are made at all levels of government, as well as the private and nonprofit sectors. If you are interested, please call or come by City Hall. Let's talk!

The April election season is coming up and I am pleased to say that there will be no change on your Board of Alderman or Municipal Court. Doug Richmond and Rick Footer have filed and are unopposed for the Board. Judge Debbie Folkedahl filed and is also unopposed for judge.

On another election note, three residents have filed for two of the surrounding road districts. Resident and former mayor, Alan York has filed for the Platte City Special Road District. Filing for the Parkville Special Road District are residents Gary Gulden for a 3 year term and John Cookinham for a 1 year term. It is essential to support and vote on April 2nd for these 3 gentlemen. The goal is to return more of our precious tax dollars home to Weatherby Lake. Our city finds itself in 3 separate road districts which works to our large disadvantage.

Finally, the Irish American Club will be hosting it's annual parade and party afterwards at the Community Center, Saturday March 16th. A lot of folks work very hard on this with all profits to the benefit of our Weatherby Lake Police Department. I will miss it this year as I will be at my Muldoon Irish Family Reunion in Melbourne, Australia.

Think Winter Safety!!!!!

Recently the Police Department was called to juveniles on the ice in an access area. The ice was unsafe as the weather had been cold enough to only create a thin layer of ice on the water in the cove areas. The Police Department contacted the juveniles as they were leaving the area on foot and one of the juveniles had broken through the ice when they stepped off a dock and was soaking wet from the frigid water. Fortunately for all concerned the juveniles were unharmed and the juvenile's parents were later contacted regarding their actions involving the ice. I feel very fortunate that no one was injured during this incident and this incident should remind everyone how dangerous going out onto lake ice is. Speaking as a parent and grandparent we should all educate our young people of the hazards of ice. In prior months my staff and I have been working with WLIC on emergency ice rescue procedures.

The surrounding communities outside Weatherby Lake have been plagued recently with thefts from <u>unlocked</u> vehicles and thefts from residence garages where the overhead door(s) have been <u>left standing open</u>. It is important to remember to secure your vehicle door(s) when parked outdoors and all residence door(s) when not in use.

As of 12/2018 there were 921 users on the Weatherby Lake Nixle notification system. To receive notifications of inclement weather conditions, roadway closings or power outages go to the Nixle link at the bottom of the City of Weatherby Lake web page http://www.cityofweatherbylake-mo.gov. Click on the Nixle logo to begin sign up for the notifications. You can receive the notifications by text, email or both text and email.



The Police Department ordered and received a hand held thermal imaging monocular after receiving additional funds in 2018 from the Weatherby Lake Irish American Club. The monocular will be utilized by department members for search and rescue both on land/water during day/night or inclement weather. I wish to thank <u>ALL</u> the partners of the Weatherby Lake Irish American Club for their continued support and assistance.

The Weatherby Lake Improvement Company has reminded me to encourage everyone to check their personal property like boats and docks throughout the winter months even though lake usage may be down we have had several reports of items breaking loose and causing damage.

WLIC Update

Just finished shoveling snow for the fourth or fifth time this winter. Snow can make for beautiful lake pictures like the one accompanying this article and provide our lake family with a lot of fun winter activities. If you get a moment, please stop by the WLIC Office at City Hall to see some of the Weatherby Lake Winter Wonderland pictures scrolling on our message boards. It should help lift your spirits to get you through to warmer weather.



As the old Watch Sergeant on *Hill Street Blues* used to say, "Be careful out there!" Remember, you are responsible for your own and your family's safety. Use common sense when sledding, skating, fishing and other winter time activities, especially on the ice. Our Lake will have varying ice depths and what's safe in one cove, may not be safe in other places. Remember that Weatherby Lake is a natural body of water. Unlike a swimming pool, there are constantly changing conditions, and inherent risks. All Members, Lake Users and Guests use the lake and access areas at their own risk. And, Members are responsible for their guests.

The WLIC is working with the Weatherby Lake Police Department to develop some wintertime lake safety procedures and has acquired some limited rescue equipment-- a flat bottom metal dingy that can be pushed across the ice for rescue assistance along with ropes, blankets, floatation equipment and other safety equipment. This will be stored at the property by the Dam. Should an ice or water emergency occur on the Lake, your first action should be to dial 911 and let the emergency responders direct activities from there. However, the WLIC ice safety equipment is available to all in an emergency. If you use it, you do so at your own risk. The WLIC does not warrant the apparatus for any particular application.

In other WLIC matters, we are preparing to place two courtesy docks and three picnic tables at the property by the Dam. We will also have a portable toilet placed there to allow Members to boat over and enjoy picnics and other quiet activities on the property. Security features will also be installed for the property to protect us as we enjoy our newest addition to the community. The use of the building itself will be off limits for use as we decide the long-term best use for the property.

A special 'thank you' goes out to Jaci Foxworthy for helping us out with some illustration needs we had for access area signage. Volunteerism is our legacy, and Jaci came through in aces!

Also remember, if you have not paid your 2019 Assessments, they are due by March 31st. If not paid by that date, Members will be subject to penalties.

The WLIC continues to look for volunteers to help serve on committees to maintain the beauty of our Lake. Stop by the WLIC Office to sign up today! Mark your calendars for the Spring Lake Clean Up on May 4th and the Lake Season Kick off on June 2nd. More details to come.

Finally, stay warm and safe. Spring will eventually come, and the Summer lake activities will begin!!
