Mayor's Comments

Greetings from City Hall. Thankfully the heat of summer has been replaced by cooler autumn breezes.

While we don't have final census numbers for Weatherby Lake, Platte County is by far the fastest growing county in the State of Missouri. The county population grew by 19.5% in the last 10 years to 106,000 people. Second place is Christian County, south of Springfield at 15%. If there should be a wide discrepancy between the number of residents on the West side of our city vs. the East side we will have to redraw our voting boundaries. We are hoping that this will not be necessary and look forward to getting our totals as soon as possible.

We have received the results of the Barry Road, Amity Road and Eastside Drive traffic study. Most of the recommendations are common sense stuff that anyone that travels that intersection could figure out. Foliage on the north side of Barry Road (in Kansas City) has been and remains a factor in 'sight distance' (engineer jargon). My input is that there are scrub trees growing out into the line of sight to the east blocking the quickly approaching vehicles coming down the hill towards the intersection. This causes vehicles going south to pull too far forward past the white stop bars, blocking the view of the other vehicles next to them.

The other sight distance issue was found on our side of Barry Road. The engineers felt that our entrance monument protruded out too far. I take high exception to this and called out the fact that our Weatherby Public Works trims the entire hill from Eastside Drive west to Forest St even though this hill is in the city limits of KCMO. When Barry was widened over 10 years ago a sizeable rock outcropping was left and that the entire hill needs to be cut back. You can be assured that our entrance monument will not be affected nor altered.

Additional recommendations were to install yellow flashing beacons to intersection warning signs located east and west of the intersection. It's suggested that the sign posts also have yellow reflective strips similar to what Weatherby has done south of the intersection. I will continue to work with KCMO on improving what I still consider a dangerous intersection.

A State traffic change is coming that will affect us this next Spring. It is my understanding that the entire 72nd Street interchange at I29 will be closed for bridge replacements, similar to what is going on south of there at 56th Street. It is estimated that this will be a 9 month project.

We have scheduled a Fall Yard Cleanup weekend for November 5th, 6th and 7th. Hopefully most of the leaves will be down by then.

Enjoy the fall colors and all the associated events including a Happy Thanksgiving to you and yours!

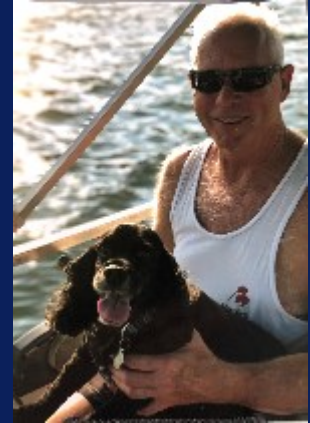

I would like to remind everyone to secure all vehicle door(s) when parked outdoors. I would also suggest that all walk-in and overhead garage door(s) be secured when not in use.

The Weatherby Lake Board of Alderman recently added a section to the Nuisance ordinance #215.101 section C. which reads in part: No PODS container can be placed on any street, highway, roadway or un-improved surface within the city. The PODS container cannot remain over 7 calendar days without a PODS permit issued by the City Clerk. The PODS permit is good for 30 days and cannot be extended. PODs, construction trailers and equipment on un-improved property are only allowed with a valid building permit issued by the city.

The WLIC wishes to remind everyone as the summer season winds down to be sure and secure **ALL** personal items stored on their watercraft, boats, etc.

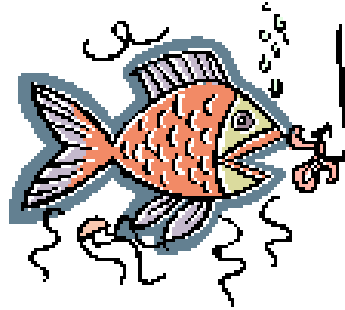

who live alone. Let us know your thoughts and ideas.

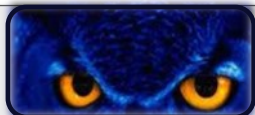
