SCAMS

Don't be the victim of a scam. Several scams are being attempted in the area at this time, please be cautious and alert. The tree trimmers and driveway repair people are attempting scams close to us. They quote you a price for a repair or tree trimming and then find something much more expensive that must be done immediately. They normally don't accept credit card and prefer cash. If you write a check they will probably want you to go to the bank with them to get cash. If you receive a call that a relative is in jail out of town and wants you to send them bond money, check it out because it is probably a scam. If you are asked to receive packages at your home or business and mail them to someone else in another country, be careful, it is probably a scam. If you receive notification you have won a foreign lottery and all you have to do to receive your money is wire or mail a small amount for taxes and fees to claim your prize it is probably a scam. No legitimate lottery should ask you for money to claim your prize. Please call the police if you receive any offers you believe may be a scam.

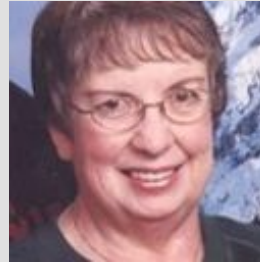

\$\$\$ A money saving tip \$\$\$ from City Hall

When titling motor vehicles, trailers or watercraft inform the DMV you're a resident of Weatherby Lake!

Did you know.....When titling motor vehicles, trailers, or watercraft with the Missouri Department of Motor Vehicles, as a resident of Weatherby Lake you should only be paying sales tax at the rate of 5.6%. *If you mistakenly use Parkville or Kansas City rather than Weatherby Lake, the DMV will charge you at a higher sales tax at the rate -- 7.1% or 8.475%, respectively.* The end result is that you'll end up paying more sales tax than required and the City of Weatherby Lake in no way benefits from the added tax.

So save yourself some money and be sure to inform the DMV you are a resident of Weatherby Lake!

Dr. Carol P. Getty, Weatherby Lake resident for 33 years, has published a book. *“Peace in Justice”* is a message for our times, one part memoir and one part essay. The book follows the trajectory of her 40 year career in the justice system and shares her observations about how the nation came to fight many ill-advised “wars on crime” shifting focuses from rehabilitating prisoners to simply filling prisons.

“There is no doubt in my mind that America can create and support a more peaceful criminal justice System. Americans are not the most evil people on the planet and we shouldn’t be locking up more people per capita than any other country in the world.”

“We have to change the rhetoric. We need a new model.”

Carol received two appointments from Governor Bruce Babbitt to the Arizona Board of Pardons and Paroles, which she served for five years before being appointed by President Ronald Reagan to the United States Parole Commission. During her 12 years on the commission she served as one of five regional commissioners, the one headquartered in KCMO, and was also served as chair for a year and a half with an appointment by President George H.W. Bush, making her the first woman to serve in this capacity. After retiring from federal service she taught criminal justice at Park University and retired 14 years later as an Emeritus Professor of Criminal Justice.
