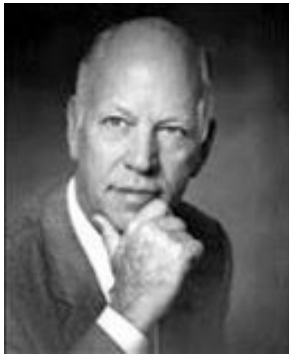

Summer is in full swing and it sure is great to see so many people using the lake. My thanks to all of the groups that are running events and programs. With so many new families coming into the area, everyone is embracing fun programs for children as well as some of the traditional evening events. Unless the weather was uncooperative, most events have been well attended.

Let me take a minute here to remember a prominent Weatherby Lake resident, Lantz Welch, who passed away last month. Our condolences go to his wife, Laura, and the members of the Welch family. His many philanthropic efforts were always appreciated and will continue through the Welch Foundation.

The long awaited Google fiber installation is in full swing. Work kicked off the third week of July and will last about 3 month. As I have informed everyone over the last two months, there will be random road closures and other traffic interruptions but we will work to keep them at a minimum. As an FYI, it is our goal to try to have the cable runs completed along the main access roads before school starts. This too should help to reduce the traffic flow backups. Please be patient with the work crews as we get through this busy phase of the project.

Bids are being received to finalize the lining of the remaining pipes in Weatherby Lake. I anticipate that this project will begin in the fall and be completed before the end of the year. This will complete the pipe lining project started several years ago.

### A MAGNIFICENT 4<sup>TH</sup> OF JULY WEEKEND

It is important that the streets are kept clear so a fire truck or ambulance can make its way to an emergency if needed. Parking on one side of the street works best. Thank you for your help and assistance.

### SCAMS

Don't be the victim of a scam. Several scams are being attempted in the area at this time, please be cautious and alert. The tree trimmers and driveway repair people are attempting scams close to us. They quote you a price for a repair or tree trimming and then find something much more expensive that must be done immediately. They normally don't accept credit card and prefer cash. If you write a check they will probably want you to go to the bank with them to get cash. If you receive a call that a relative is in jail out of town and wants you to send them bond money, check it out because it is probably a scam. If you are asked to receive packages at your home or business and mail them to someone else in another country, be careful, it is probably a scam. If you receive notification you have won a foreign lottery and all you have to do to receive your money is wire or mail a small amount for taxes and fees to claim your prize it is probably a scam. No legitimate lottery should ask you for money to claim your prize. Please call the police if you receive any offers you believe may be a scam.

### OUT GOING MAIL

Just a reminder, Please don't put outgoing mail in your personal mail box. Use the large mail box at City Hall or take the mail to the Post Office. Thieves drive around looking for the raised red flags so they can steal mail. If there are checks in the mail, they can be washed and forged.

### THINK SAFETY

The summer is in full swing. School starts in mid August. People are using the lake, the access areas, the streets and the parks. Be extremely careful. Please pay close attention to your driving. Slow down when you pass pedestrians and cyclists. Drive at low speed in the access

## WLIC Update

Well, we are entering the month of August and the temperature is hot and the Lake is providing a welcome relief to our Members. The 4<sup>th</sup> of July activities went relatively smoothly and the fireworks were great!

WLIC activities include:

- Access Area Maintenance at C Cove, A1 Cove & K Cove as well as the V & L2 Access Areas to repair erosion caused by the summer rains.
- A riprap seawall and walking path on the unimproved side of O Cove will be completed as soon as weather permits. Members whose boats and docks are affected will be notified when the final timing is determined.
- A final decision on lowering the Lake to permit further WLIC and Member seawall improvements will be made in August. A major factor in making the decision will be the weather between now and then.
- The second New Member Orientation was held on Saturday, July 16<sup>th</sup> with about 20 Members participating! The opinions of those participating was that the information was very helpful.
- The WLIC will be meeting with representatives of the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MO DNR) next month to discuss our concerns about the impact of developments in our watershed and the quality and safety of our Lake.
- The WLIC is investigating vendors to provide additional sand for the C Point Swim Beach. The sand must be heat treated to protect the Lake from Zebra Mussels. We hope to have additional sand for the beach spread prior to the end of the Lake season.
- The MO DNR is inspected our Dam on July 19<sup>th</sup>. This inspection happens routinely every two years and the WLIC does not foresee any issues.

We hope everyone will continue to have a wonderful summer. See you next month!

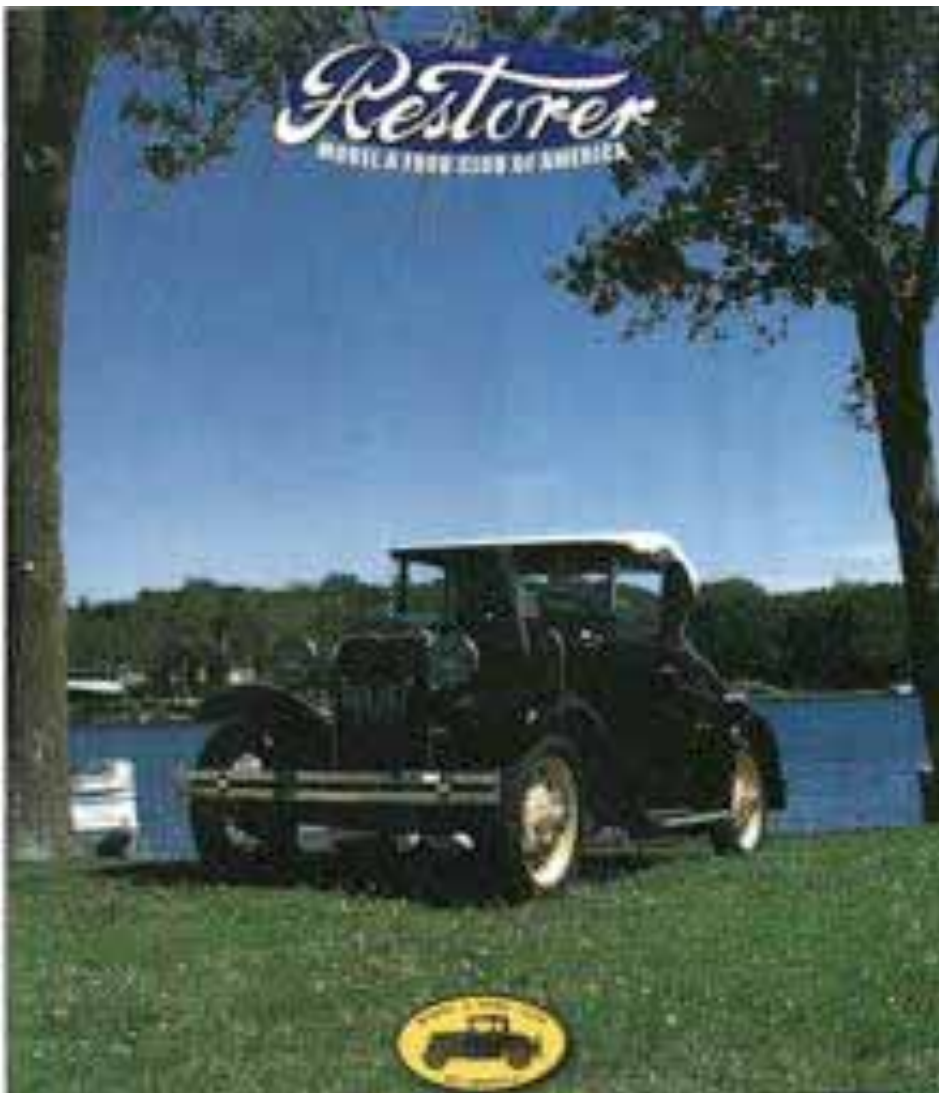




## Congratulations to Weatherby Lake's Ginny Nussbeck.

varying meanings across cultures, but smiling is

universal sign of happiness and acceptance.

Smiles make a person seem more  
attractive, sociable and confident. A genuine smile  
makes you more likeable to everyone. A research  
study conducted by Orbit Complete discovered  
that 69% of people find women more attractive  
when they smile than when they are wearing  
makeup.

Only about 25% of us smile over 20 times per day  
at the office. Pump those numbers up, because  
people who smile frequently are more likely to get  
promoted. Smiling is innate. We start smiling in  
our sleep right after birth.

It's good to be seen: People can recognize  
smiles from a football field away, making it the  
most easily recognizable facial expression.
