Mayors Comments

Summertime greetings.

It's been an unusually warm summer so far and we remain in a serious drought at this writing. As we natives have heard, 'stick around, the weather will change soon'. Welcome to the dog days of summer! It still beats winter in my opinion.

The July 4th holiday seemed to have spanned a longer period of time this year since Independence Day fell on a Wednesday. The SWAT dance was very well attended on Saturday, June 30th and the next night the annual City / WLIC Softball Game was played. The City team recaptured the travelling trophy with a 13-8 win. The parade on the 4th had many participants and went very smoothly despite the new route through the city. Our police department doubled the number of officers on duty on the holiday and we had very few fireworks related reports.

Many kudos' to longtime Eastside Alderman, Tanya Finn, for all of her many efforts in coordinating almost all the events related to the multi day holiday. She would want me to report that we are still \$3000 short of meeting the fireworks display cost of \$17000. It's not too late to bring your contribution to City Hall.

Very few may know that Weatherby Lake finds itself in three separate road districts; Parkville Special Road District, Platte City Special Road District and Platte County Road District. Our city gets very few tax dollars, if any, for our streets from these 3 boards. There will be a vacancy for each in the April election cycle. It has been many years since we have had any Weatherby residents on any of these boards. If there are any citizens remotely interested in running for these vacancies please send me an email at sclark@weatherbylake-mo.gov and we can determine which district you are in and what is involved in bringing more of our tax money 'home'.

Recently your Board of Aldermen approved a new sign ordinance concerning size and placement. The biggest change is the location, which is 15 feet from the edge of the pavement. This pertains to all signs but not limited to real estate and political. As we approach elections in August and again in November please keep this 15 foot rule in mind.

The Missouri state legislature has approved a ballot issue, Proposition D, for the November 6th election which would fund the State Highway Patrol and the Missouri Department of Transportation (MODOt). This issue, if approved, would increase the fuel tax by 2.5 cents a year for the next four years. It is strongly supported by a diverse statewide coalition that includes farmers, business people, labor, local governments and law enforcement. If passed, our city of Weatherby Lake would receive an additional \$27,101 for our streets and Platte County would receive \$839,855. I'm sure you will hear more about this issue before November. Your consideration is appreciated.

The 4th of July holiday has passed and The Weatherby Lake Improvement Company continues with, "Shore Patrol." These uniformed personnel will be patrolling WLIC Access Area's to check for WLIC identification and compliance of WLIC rules. Please be courteous to these personnel as they are there to help provide a safe environment for **ALL** members.

This month during a meeting at city hall with several lake residents I was asked what I thought the residents could do to improve their overall safety while at home. My answer was to be **AWARE** of your surroundings at **ALL TIMES**. I suggest all unoccupied vehicles be locked and to close all garage doors when not in use. I also recommend to lock all doors at your residence whether you are at home or not. It is a fact that a number of malevolent person(s) drive the city streets on a daily basis. If you leave your garage door or pedestrian door(s) open anyone can drive by your residence and view what you have inside your garage, including the type of cars you own or what you have inside your residence.

In the past weeks the Police Department has been in contact with loose canines and barking canines that reside within the city limits. City ordinance 205.090 reads in part:

The following acts are hereby declared to be prohibited and it shall be unlawful for any person to engage in or allow an animal owned by or possessed by such person to engage in the following activities:

Fail to prevent any animal from leaving the owner's premises unless said animal is under restraint as defined in this Chapter; or

Allow any animal to: Continually bark, howl, yelp or make loud and raucous noises.

LONGEVITY CLUB



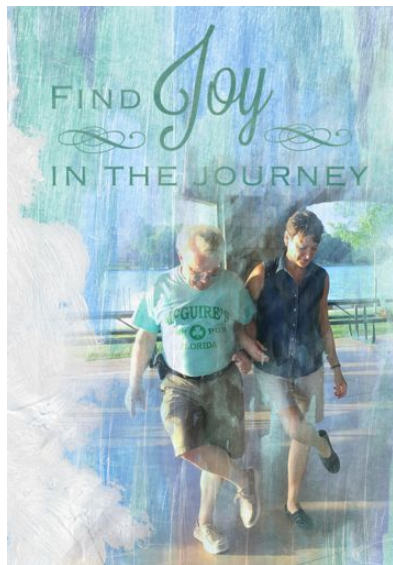
