The message we took away from our chance meeting is: "While it might be personally gratifying to track the path



our deeds take, it is not a necessary criteria for those deeds to come to fulfillment. We can't fully give of ourselves if we are always looking backwards, no more than we can safely travel forward if we spend more time looking in our rear view mirror."

It was a good reminder that regardless of what basket we drop our pennies...even in obscure and distant locales, there is always a reward even if we never know the final results. I'm grateful for the lessons I have learned, both past and current, from those along the path.

# **Mayors Comments**

Welcome to autumn in the most beautiful city in the area! It was a hot and extremely dry summer but I may be missing it in another couple of months.

As you will read in Chief Davis' column, the City welcomes the newest members of our Police Department: Full time Officer Michael Nance, and Reserve Officer Forrest Woolley. Both of these gentlemen are United States military veterans. With Officer Nance's swearing in, the City has finally reached full police staffing. We continue to maintain excellent 24-hour police coverage and have quality reserve officers to call on as needed.

Working with the Board of Aldermen and the City department heads, we have had individual work sessions and have put together a very comprehensive 2019 budget. We will finish 2018 with another surplus which allows us to purchase equipment for both the Police and Public Works Departments and still have a reserve remaining.

Believe it or not the 2020 Census is right around the corner! City Clerk Gwen Cenac and I have already had a meeting with a representative of the US Census Bureau. There will be 4 different ways to complete the census: online, paper, telephone or a knock on your door (if the first 3 haven't been done first). You will begin to see folks walking around our city streets in March verifying that addresses truly exist. It is extremely important that everyone complete a census because it determines a wide variety of important things including Congressional representation and tax money coming home to Weatherby Lake, just to name a couple. As a side note, Marvin Postma, a former deceased Weatherby resident, was high up in the Regional Census Bureau. Marvin lived on Roberts Road and used to tow boats previous to Hank Nussbeck.

The Senior 'Breakfast Club' will meet at City Hall 10AM Wednesday October 10th, featuring Rick Neece, WLIC President. On November 14th, same time and place, the tentative speaker is Platte County 1st District Commissioner, Dagmar Wood.

Plan on attending the SWAT Oktoberfest on Saturday, October 6th at C-Point. Lots of German food, beverages and music. This is a fundraiser to purchase a 'Tiny House' for a homeless veteran.

As you go to the polls on Tuesday, November 6th, please consider a 'YES' on Proposition D. As I mentioned a couple of months ago, our City, County and State will benefit greatly by a 2.5 cent increase in the gasoline tax in each of the next 4 years. In 4 years the extra 10 cents per gallon of gas will bring Weatherby Lake \$27,000 for our streets, and Platte County would receive \$840,000. This will also fund the State Highway Patrol and the Department of Transportation (MoDOT) and is supported by the Governor, both US Senators and a wide and diverse coalition of business, farmers, labor and law enforcement. ## Kops Korner

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce our new full time Officer, Michael Nance. Officer Nance was sworn in on September 17th, 2018. Officer Nance worked three years for the Kansas City Kansas Public Schools as a school resource Officer (SRO) assigned to a middle and high school. On several occasions completed residence check forms have been left in the water bill payment box outside city hall during non-business hours. The Jeremy Katzenberger Memorial Triathlon was conducted on 09-09-2018, with over 200 participants. By all accounts the event was a success with minimum traffic congestion. I would like to thank all the organizers for an excellent well-executed event.

Recently without prior warning the department was notified that three of our automated external defibrillators (AED's) were under recall and would require a large service charge to repair. The department had no budget or plans to repair or replace these AED's. After speaking with Darrell Coleman from the Weatherby Lake Irish American Club he agreed that previously donated funds to the department would be best served to purchase three new AED's. These three AED's have been ordered and will replace the recalled equipment. I wish to thank <u>ALL</u> the members of the Weatherby Lake Irish American Club for their continued support.

In the past weeks the Police Department has been called to several properties on tall grass/weeds. It is the <u>responsibility of the property owner</u> to maintain their property. City ordinance Weeds, High Grass or Other Vegetation 215.030 reads in part:

Failure To Keep Weeds, High Grass And Other Vegetation Cut And Removed, A Nuisance. All persons owning or occupying any lot or tract of land in the City shall keep the weeds, high grass and other vegetation growing on such property cut and removed. Whenever such weeds, high grass or other vegetation shall attain the height of eight (8) inches, it shall be deemed a public nuisance. The word "weeds", as used herein, shall be held to include all vegetable growths except cultivated plants, trees and shrubs.

Daily Violation: Each day that a nuisance shall be maintained is a separate offense.


