# FIREWORKS ORDINANCE REMINDER New section passed in 2013

E.

- 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to use or display, or **for any owner, renter, or person in control of any property** to allow the use or display of "fireworks" authorized by this Section within the City limits at any time whatsoever except on July second (2nd), third (3rd) and fourth (4th) between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 10:00 P.M.
- 2. It shall be unlawful for the owner, renter, or person in control of any property to allow the sale, purchase, use, ignition, display or explosion of the **fireworks** prohibited by subsection (B) of this section by another person upon any such property.
- 3. For purposes of this subsection (E), the actions of a person found on any real property ("actor") shall be deemed to have been allowed unless the owner, renter, or person in control of any property demonstrates that the actor was trespassing on the property at the time of said act.

Bottle rockets and all other aerial fireworks are illegal. Citations will be issued for the use of any aerial fireworks.

#### **DAM CLOSING**

Remember the road across the dam will be reduced to **one lane** before the parade and **closed** to all vehicular and pedestrian traffic immediately after the parade crosses the dam on the  $4^{\rm TH}$  of July. The dam will remain closed until after the fireworks are completed and the fireworks crew leaves. In case of rain the fireworks will be on July  $5^{\rm th}$  and the dam will remain closed all day.

#### **ACCESS AREA PARKING**

Please be courteous when parking on the street near the access areas. Don't block driveways or fire hydrants and leave a minimum of 10 feet of paved roadway to allow safe passage. Ask all of your guests to park on one side of the street for safety. 77th Terrace will be posted NO PARKING from Scenic Drive to the Weatherby Lake Improvement Company parking area.

#### **BOAT SECURITY**

Every year fishing tackle, batteries and gas tanks are stolen from boats around the lake and this year is no exception. Gas has been reported stolen from boats this summer. I have noticed several boats in access areas with fishing tackle lying in the open area of the boats. This invites theft. Help prevent theft, please don't leave unsecured items in your boat.

Summer is in full swing and the WLIC is as well! We are sprucing up C Point in preparation for the Fourth of July.

PLEASE NOTE THE NEW JULY 4<sup>th</sup> VEHICLE, SWIM BEACH AND BOAT PARKING RULES contained in this newsletter and sent to you. With the increased population at the lake, we want to ensure that our Members and C Point Access Area holders have priority regarding C Point usage and safety. Specifically, note that all vehicles entering C Point must have either resident or non-resident stickers on them and pedestrians entering C Point must have their bracelets with current permits with them. All guests must be accompanied by a Member who has bracelets with them!

If you are planning on being on the water during the fireworks display, remember you must have your white anchor light lit, red and green navigational lights in working order and headlights are to be used only for docking, not while underway.

The WLIC Lake Season Kick Off event was very well attended despite the high winds. Adults and kids alike had a great time and the food, drink and music was excellent. Our thanks to all the individual volunteers and clubs who participated in making the event a success.

Most of you have probably noticed a new invasive species of plant called "Duckweed" impacting the lake. We are investigating possible remediation methods and will keep you informed of our progress.

# **COMMISSION AWARDS STORMWATER GRANTS**

The Platte County Commissioners awarded \$200,000 in 2017 stormwater grants to area municipalities and community groups to address water runoff and flooding problems. Grant certificates were presented at the Tuesday, June 6 Commission administrative session. The annual grant program is funded through the county's half cent sales tax for parks, recreation and stormwater. Grant offerings approved were to the Thousand Oaks Homeowners Association. \$28,725; Lake Waukomis Association. \$25,870; Par IV Homeowners Association. \$53,294; Weatherby Lake Environmental Trust, \$5,100; City of Platte Woods, \$20,220; City of Parkville, \$11,000; Northwest Moore Drive Homeowners Association, \$47,231; and Jason Kelling and Lynnette Lockhart, \$8,560.

## WEATHERBY LAKE FISHING CLUB ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

To better manage our C-Point facility and to ensure the safety of all our Members and Guests during this busy holiday, we will be implementing the following rules for the 4th of July.

- C-Point Parking will be limited to vehicles with a current Weatherby Lake
  City Permit or WLIC NR Permit. Cars without these stickers will not be allowed
  access even if a Member is present in the car. Credentials will be checked at the
  top of the hill leading into C-Point.
- For walkers into C-Point, member bracelet credentials will be required
  and checked at the top of the hill. If you are hosting guests, they must be with
  you, or you must greet them at the top of the hill and escort them down.
- Boat docking at the Swim Dock will be limited to three boats deep to ensure safety for swimmers and to maintain structural integrity of the dock.
- Saving additional parking spaces will be prohibited. One space per vehicle. No campers or trailers allowed.
- Overnight setup of tents and boat docking is prohibited prior to sunrise the 4th of July.
- 6. Fireworks are prohibited on all W.L.I.C. Access Areas.

## Our lake is under stress Please help us get it healthier!

You no doubt you've seen the green floating algae currently and pink algae earlier this year. We believe these blooms are being exacerbated by excessive Phosphorus that comes from improper use of fertilizers— especially ones with high concentrations of phosphorus—within our watershed. The WLIC reached out to Mike McDermott of The Grass Pad for some helpful instructions for our membership to consider so we can keep these blooms under control. Please take a moment to read Mike's important recommendations.

W.L.I.C. Office

Longer summer days bring more sunlight and warmer water temperatures. Dormant lake weeds and algae prosper in these conditions and pop up just in time to celebrate the fourth of July. Here are a few tips to keep the lake healthy all year long.

Use **low phosphorus soaps** to wash patio furniture and autos and boats -- Brands like Simple Green.

Use **low phosphorus fertilizer** to keep your lawns healthy – Brands appropriate for lake residents include Golf Course Starter, 16-2-2, Loveland Renovator Pro 30-0-3, Loveland Summer Pro 20-0-5 or Loveland Weed & Feed 12-0-4 (All Available at the Grass Pad)

Sweep up and dispose of goose poop and pet waste. NEVER sweep into the lake.

Don't blow trash, dirt, poop, fertilizer, grass clippings onto the street where storm water will dump it into the lake.

Healthy green grass is an efficient filter to control erosion and filter to control erosion and filter urban pollutants. Today low phosphorus lawn fertilizers are readily available to lake residents. Follow label directions and blow remnants from street, drive and patio back onto the grass. Once watered in, these will be quickly bound up in the grass plant and root mass and stay put. They are meant for your lawn, not your driveway!

Although pontoons seem harmless, accidents can occur, so please operate your motorized boat at least 100 feet from shore to avoid injuring swimmers.

Keep in mind that most of our rules, such as lighting specifications, are universal to all boats on all bodies of water, because the red/green configuration on the bow (front) and the white 360° light on the stern (rear) help other boats determine your distance and direction so they can avoid collisions with you. Docking lights (the two white lights on the "front" of the boat) are not "headlights" ... they are used only when docking the boat, otherwise they impair the vision of other boaters when viewed from head on.

Although our WL Boat Patrol are technically not "Police", they are trained in water safety and are doing their job to keep the lake safe, so thank you for showing them courtesy and appreciation for their efforts.


