The SWAT Dance takes place Saturday June 30th and that kicks off the activities for the 4th of July. Sunday, July 1st at 4 PM at Cristhaven Park it's the Games on the Greens. The annual softball game between the City and the WLIC takes place at the Community Center Field at 6:30 PM. The City team will try to retake the traveling trophy. It seems to always be a hot, steamy event, no matter who wins. On 06/03/2018 the department participated in the Weatherby Lake Improvement Company's annual "Spring Kick Off" at the C-Point Access Area. The department members were joined this year by members of the Burlington Northern Sante Fe

Railroad Police. Even though we do not have a railroad within Weatherby Lake, almost every citizen has some interaction with the railroad. I would like to thank the BNSF Officers for their participation in this event.

We have experienced several spring

storms during the last few weeks, I would like to stress that every household utilize a weather application

on a "smart" device, sign up for free weather notifications on Nixle or purchase a weather radio. The weather radios can be purchased at "Price Chopper" and Police Department staff can assist you with weather radio programming.

The Fourth of July is nearing and the city has mailed an informational flyer to every residence with a calendar of events and a parade map. I encourage everyone to review the parade map as the traditional parade route has changed. Expect minor traffic congestion during the parade. A reminder that the dam will be closed to <u>all traffic</u> on July 4th after 10:00 a.m. to set up for the fireworks display. The dam will reopen for traffic by the morning of 07/05/2018.

The Weatherby Lake Improvement Company has reminded me that no fireworks are permitted on WLIC Access Areas. On July 4th, holiday parking and entrance rules are in place for the C-Point Access Area. Refer to wlic.org for details.

It is my wish for all to have a safe and enjoyable 4^{th} of July holiday and I would like to remind everyone of the fireworks ordinance (210.225 In-Part).

The following types of fireworks are always prohibited within the City of Weatherby Lake, and it shall be unlawful for any person to carry on or about his/her person, use or display the following (unless authorized by the provisions of Subsection (F) of this Section):

All aerial devices. Including, but not limited to, sky rockets, missile-type rockets, bottle rockets, helicopter aerial spinners, Roman candles and mine shells.

Audible ground devices. Containing over twenty-five (25) milligrams of pyrotechnic composition, including, but not limited to, firecrackers, chasers, M-80's, cherry bombs, etc.

The following types of fireworks are allowed within the City limits of Weatherby Lake on July 2, 3 and 4 between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 10:00 P.M.:

Ground and hand-held sparkling devices. Such as sparklers, cane fountains, wheels and ground spinners.

Audible ground devices. Containing twenty-five (25) milligrams or less of pyrotechnic composition, such as small firecrackers and lady fingers.

Novelties and trick noisemakers. Not classified as common fireworks by the United States Department of Transportation, such as snakes, smoke devices and snappers.

It shall be unlawful for the owner, renter, or person in control of any property to allow the sale, purchase, use, ignition, display or explosion of the above prohibited fireworks.







NEW PARADE ROUTE (corrected)






To better manage our C-Point facility and to ensure the safety of all our Members and Guests during this busy holiday, we will be implementing the following rules for the 4th of July.

- 1. C-Point Parking will be limited to vehicles with a current Weatherby Lake City Permit or WLIC NR Permit. Cars without these stickers will not be allowed access even if a Member is present in the car. Credentials will be checked at the top of the hill leading into C-Point.
- **2.** For walkers into C-Point, member bracelet credentials will be required and checked at the top of the hill. If you are hosting guests, they must be with you, or you must greet them at the top of the hill and escort them down.
- **3.** Boat docking at the Swim Dock will be limited to three boats deep to ensure safety for swimmers and to maintain structural integrity of the dock.
- **4. Saving additional parking spaces will be prohibited.** One space per vehicle. No campers or trailers allowed.
- **5. Overnight setup of tents and boat docking is prohibited** prior to sunrise the 4th of July.
- 6. Fireworks are prohibited on <u>all</u> W.L.I.C. Access Areas.
