From the Editor

Mayor's Comments

Get ready for all of the 4th of July festivities!

Many events happen at the best city in the world this time of year; from a WLIC vs The City Annual Softball Game on Sunday, June 30th, Sand Volleyball on July 2nd, a full day of activites on July 4th, a SAV dance on July 5th at C-Point and another the next night by the Yacht Club on Saturday the 6th of July. If you haven't had the opportunity to contribute to the fireworks fund, it's never to late to do so at City Hall.

You have probably noticed that the City painted the speed limit sign on the road pavement at Eastside Drive and Barry Road. Recently on Facebook many reacted positively when Rick Footer asked for feedback on doing more of this and other measures elsewhere on our streets. Upon approval of the Board of Aldermen, we anticipate painting more speed limit signs. However, it is my concern that there could also be 'too much of a good thing', so we will proceed cautiously and accordingly. All of these initiatives are due to feedback we received last fall from City Long Range Planning sessions.

Many are concerned that our police don't write enough speeding tickets. I will assure you that we have stepped up our enforcement and wrote more tickets last month than we ever have before. On occasion, the police, also, use two cars simultaneously and ticket those that think once they see a police car the coast is clear for speeding. In the last few days a neighbors medium size dog was hit and killed in the street in view of my kitchen window. Unfortunately we have residents that feel the need to recklessly exceed the speed limit and be distracted by a cell phone while doing so. It's not just the outsiders that 'cut through', it's our residents too. Our police are aware of that, as well, and are being proactive thru community relations.

I am pleased to inform you that the City has inked an agreement with Water District #6 to install reciprocal connections of water in the event of an emergency. We did this due to the fact that neither entity has more than one current water source. It is anticipated to be completed by late fall.

I am happy and proud to announce that we have hired a new police officer, Victor Correa. Officer Correa is a pleasant, outgoing individual and will complement our entire Police staff. Please welcome him when you see him out on patrol.


Be aware that the trash pick up will be delayed this week. Trash day this first week of July will be Saturday, July 6th.

The Weatherby Lake Improvement Company reminds everyone as we kick off the spring-summer season please do not leave any unsecured items: fishing rods and tackle, coolers, life jackets, paddles or any item of value on your boat(s) unattended.

As the 4th of July holiday is approaching it is important to know the city ordinance regulations on fireworks. Weatherby Lake Ordinance #210.225 Fireworks reads in part:

The following types of fireworks are always prohibited within the City of Weatherby Lake, and it shall be unlawful for any person to carry on or about his/her person, use or display the following (unless authorized by the provisions of Subsection (F) of this Section):

All aerial devices. Including, but not limited to, sky rockets, missile-type rockets, bottle rockets, helicopter aerial spinners, Roman candles and mine shells.

Audible ground devices. Containing over twenty-five (25) milligrams of pyrotechnic composition, including, but not limited to, firecrackers, chasers, M-80's, cherry bombs, etc.

The following types of fireworks are allowed within the City limits of Weatherby Lake on July 2, 3 and 4 between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 10:00 P.M.:

Ground and hand-held sparkling devices. Such as sparklers, cane fountains, wheels and ground spinners.

Audible ground devices. Containing twenty-five (25) milligrams or less of pyrotechnic composition, such as small firecrackers and lady fingers.

Novelties and trick noisemakers. Not classified as common fireworks by the United States Department of Transportation, such as snakes, smoke devices and snappers.

Hello fellow residents of Weatherby Lake. I am Bella Catano, your 2019 summer intern. I am super excited to be working within the community I live in. I am going to be a senior this coming fall at William Jewell College. I am a student athlete studying Business and Nonprofit and also playing soccer there. I was really interested in the WLIC internship because I wanted to see how things worked around the lake, work with a nonprofit, and get more involved in my community. So far this job has helped me accomplish those goals.

I have already completed so many fun and interesting things regarding the lake and this community. One of the tasks I do is to test water every week for E. coli levels. Closing the lake is never the optimal choice, however keeping the community safe is the WLIC's largest priority. I have also been responsible for kayak rack inspections, which is just ensuring people have the correct identification and permits on their kayaks. I really enjoy getting the opportunity to be on the lake. I got to go help Beth place new lights on buoys and even got to move a buoy to the middle of a cove. We just recently placed a brand new bouy close to the Venita Access Area to signify the area where boats should go slow enough to protect members using the Venita Access Area, since it is a no wake zone.

I also help with anything they need me to do in the office. Which ranges from a wide variety of tasks including answering phone calls to sending out dock and kayak rack offers. This past week, I helped with planting new plants at the Pease property. I was the water girl, so I gave each plant the water it needed for that day. I also attended my first board meeting. It was very rewarding to be an honorary board member.

The first week I started working I had the opportunity to help plan and set up the Lake Season Kickoff. I helped to create the sack lunches we gave out, which surprisingly took us about three days to do. After all of that, I got to work the actual event. I helped set up at the Pease property and then we handed out the sack lunches we created. I thought the event was very fun, maybe I'm biased because I helped set it up. A good crowd attended which was the goal, hey who doesn't love free lunch!

I have been here for just about a month now and I can tell you that everyday brings a new challenge. Beth, Rick, and Larissa are constantly adapting to what the days throw at them. It never ceases to amaze me how well all of them deal with it. They couldn't complete their work without the awesome volunteers that the WLIC has. These awesome volunteers help the WLIC with so many things. They help to get water for E. coli testing, help set up summer kick off, and everything in between to help keep the lake safe and beautiful.

I am excited to see what this next coming month has in store for me regarding my internship. I will be sad when I have to leave but I am deeply grateful to have received the opportunity of being an intern with the WLIC.




