Mayor's Comments

Finally, it's the best time of the year to fully enjoy our little piece of heaven here at Weatherby Lake!

It is with sadness to inform you that one of my predecessors as mayor has recently passed. Pauli Kendrick was an Eastside alderperson before being elected mayor in 1996 and served until late 2003. My condolences to husband Ed and their family.

On a positive note, we, the City of Weatherby Lake has inked a cooperative / cost sharing agreement with the City of Kansas City, MO to conduct a comprehensive traffic study of the intersection of Eastside Drive, Barry Road and Amity Drive. Because of feedback from Mayor Pro Tem Richmond we were able to negotiate a change in contractors to conduct the study. We will closely monitor the progress of this worthwhile safety study.

It has been unusually cool and rainy up until now, but the vegetation sure likes it. I believe if I listen close enough I can even hear my grass growing. It's hard to keep up with. Our Public Works guys are in the same situation as the rest of us; they too are having a hard time keeping up with mowing the street right-of-ways and other areas of our City.

The street resurfacing of Wayland and Hillside Drives is complete. For the last few years the City has partnered with Platte County and realized substantial savings on the asphalt and labor of all paving projects. Director George Lowman has correctly identified and prioritized all of our city streets, closely estimated how much each will cost and has overseen and directed the work. Thank you George!

To maintain our streets in good condition is a very expensive proposition. If you travel on Kansas City streets as I do, you can tell that they are not able to properly maintain their streets nearly as well as we do. As I have mentioned before, the three road districts that we find ourselves in return only .25 cents to us for every dollar that we give them through our personal property taxes. Within the last few weeks Missouri became the last state in the Union to pass the Wayfair legislation meaning that companies without an investment in Missouri will pay the same sales tax rates as those who do thru internet sales. This levels the playing field for local companies and us the Missouri communities that need the extra revenue. My point is that I believe we need a vote of you, the taxpayers to approve a use tax that would reap the internet taxes and should be 100% earmarked for our Weatherby roads and streets.

The water tower next to the Community Center is 16 years old and in need of some safety, mechanical and aesthetic updates. We are preparing and 'Request for Proposal' and the belief is that all can be done for under \$200,000. The funding for that is already in a specific account.

The Park Board has booked 4 free 'Concerts in the Park' this summer, all to take place at Crithaven Park on Roberts Road. Check this Newsletter for dates and times.

Alderman Tanya Finn has announced that this year's theme for the Fourth of July festivities is 'The Olympics'. The parade route will be the same as last year; ending up at the Community Center. The excellent fireworks display that we always sponsor has already been booked and we have 'upped the ante' this year to \$20,000. Drop off your donation contributions at City Hall.

Please safely and responsively enjoy the boating season and all the amenities of our beautiful City!

This year's 4th of July parade will follow a "modified" route and end at the Weatherby Lake Community Center (#8230 N.W. Potomac Ave.) The city website and flyers will contain the modified parade route.

As the 4th of July holiday is approaching it is important to know the city ordinance regulations on fireworks. Weatherby Lake Ordinance #210.225 Fireworks reads in part:

The following types of fireworks are always prohibited within the City of Weatherby Lake, and it shall be unlawful for any person to carry on or about his/her person, use or display the following (unless authorized by the provisions of Subsection (F) of this Section):

All aerial devices. Including, but not limited to, sky rockets, missile-type rockets, bottle rockets, helicopter aerial spinners, Roman candles and mine shells.

Audible ground devices. Containing over twenty-five (25) milligrams of pyrotechnic composition, including, but not limited to, firecrackers, chasers, M-80's, cherry bombs, etc.

The following types of fireworks are allowed within the City limits of Weatherby Lake on July 2, 3 and 4 between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 10:00 P.M.:

Ground and hand-held sparkling devices. Such as sparklers, cane fountains, wheels and ground spinners.

Audible ground devices. Containing twenty-five (25) milligrams or less of pyrotechnic composition, such as small firecrackers and lady fingers.

Novelties and trick noisemakers. Not classified as common fireworks by the United States Department of Transportation, such as snakes, smoke devices and snappers.

The Weatherby Lake Improvement Company wishes to remind everyone that NO FIREWORKS are allowed on WLIC property.

The staff of the Weatherby Lake Police Department wishes everyone a happy and safe 4th of July holiday!!!!!!

WLIC Update

In spite of all the rain we've had in the last two weeks we have completed the first round of dock inspections and will notify members with violations shortly. The WLIC would like to thank all the volunteers associated with the dock inspection process and the lake clean-up efforts earlier this month.

Remember to always wear your member identification bracelets when visiting any of the WLIC access areas and properties. Our WLIC water and shore patrols are checking for unauthorized visitors now.

Please always check the Platte County Health Department regulations (<https://www.plattecountyhealthdept.com>) for any Covid 19 requirements regarding the WLIC properties.

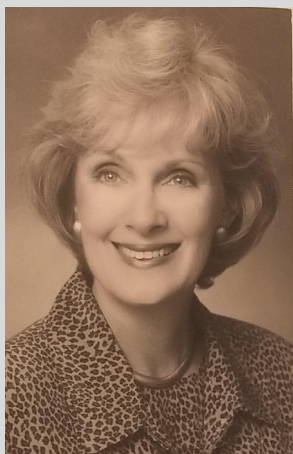
Also, the WLIC office at City Hall will reopened on June 1 and WLIC meetings will be conducted in person thereafter. Currently, we are scheduling Space & Dock Committee meetings to be held in June, July and August. Refer to wlic.org or emails sent out regarding final dates.

We would especially like to draw your attention to a meeting of the Long Range Planning (LRP) Committee to be held at the Weatherby Lake Community Center on Wednesday, June 16th at 6PM. The topic will be the future use of the former Pease property next to the dam. Presentations by working groups appointed after the last LRP meeting will provide detailed proposals for the two options most favored by a member survey taken in conjunction with the 2019 WLIC Annual Meeting ("greenspace" and "picnic shelter" options) as well as a third proposal to construct an "all weather" building on the property. The WLIC purchased this property for the overriding purpose of protecting the dam from nearby construction. Special presenters include Jason Davis from our lake engineering firm, Affinis and Mr. Gary Van Riessen, a nationally recognized dam engineering consultant who has advised the WLIC on our dam engineering matters in the past. Also attending will be a representative of the WLIC legal counsel, Kessinger Law Firm, P.C., who has provided several legal opinions relative to the Dam and the surrounding WLIC properties. They have counseled us on increased insurance costs and liability exposure relating to services suggested in several former Pease property usage options.

In conclusion, the WLIC is excited to begin a new lake season and celebrate a safe Memorial Day with family, long time friends and new members.

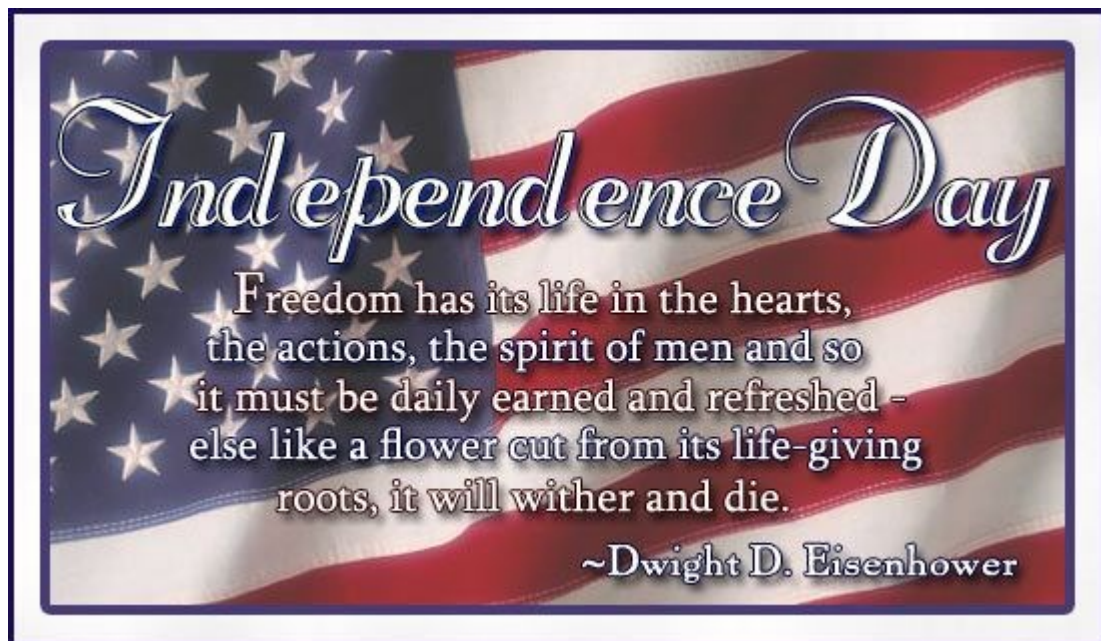

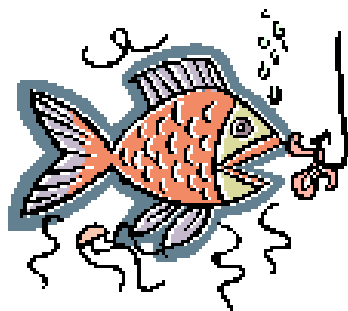
ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

Attend a Happy Hour: You take an appetizer and your own beverage of choice.

Host a Dinner: You provide your home, the main dish, water, coffee and tea.

Host a Happy Hour: You provide your home, one appetizer, tea and water.

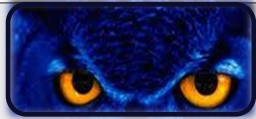
