From the Editor

WHO DO YOU TRUST?

I recently received a letter advising me that my car was being recalled due to dangerously faulty air bags that could explode and hurl sharp pieces of shrapnel on impact. Really? How does something like this manage to get by the safety inspectors at the design level and end up needing to recall 1.7 million cars for repair? Reports of 23 deaths have already resulted. So, as I sat at the dealer's repair shop, this thought was still bouncing around in my mind...I chatted briefly with a mechanic about how an error of this magnitude could not be addressed for over a decade...some vehicles were 2009 models. He said he had seen similar cases several times in his career. Is nothing as it appears? In what can we place our trust? How did life evolve to this...where we cannot believe or trust not just some politicians, but so many entities on so many levels?

I believe that trust is born and nurtured from birth and up. I observed a really watchful pre-toddler in her stroller...she was curious about me, but would not share a smile for anything. I was smiling and winking and doing those goofy adult maneuvers that we do around babies. She was having none of it. I mulled it all over for a while and was reminded that trust is in the making at a very young age...she was just 9 months. So, I think one could say trust must be a natural instinct that we attend to from our first breath. The toddler's mom was getting her recalled airbag repaired, too, and then she had a doctor's appointment because she needed to get a second opinion on a wrong diagnosis. Oops...there's that trust thing again.

I don't want to become a cynic, but I don't think it is wise to be over-trusting either. My



mom used to tell me to trust my intuition...pay attention to what might seem unusual but pay even closer attention to what might seem reliable and trustworthy. Sure, we need to be watchful that we are not taken advantage of, but we need to be watchful for those people and situations that strike a strong sense of goodness and sincerity. I embrace the belief that trust begets trust, just like kindness begets kindness or joy begets joy, and so on.

Not all community leaders are pure of heart, but not all are self serving either. I say we are pretty fortunate in our community that we have a great line-up of leaders who are committed to our best interests and that makes Weatherby Lake a very special place to work, play, volunteer and raise our families. There is something for everyone...be willing to trust your intuition and volunteer. Remember, trust begets trust.

Mayor's Comments

Late summer greetings!

We have a treasure here at Weatherby Lake that is 45+ years in the making, and that treasure is Tanya Finn. This last Thursday, July 25th Tanya was recognized by The Missouri Municipal League as an Outstanding Civic Leader of our city at an awards banquet at the Historic Longview Mansion in Lee's Summit. Nominated by our Pat Medill, Tanya was recognized for her decades commitment of volunteerism. Briefly, Tanya was a founding member of the Park Board, served on the WLIC Space & Dock Committee and the Election & Credentials Committee, Coordinator of the Fireworks Fund and 4th of July Parade, the city's Shredding & Recycling Event, has been an Alderman for 13 years, organizes several City & WLIC mailings and serves on the Platte County Senior Fund.

When you are out and about give Tanya a big Weatherby Lake hug and hearty 'thank you'!

Complacency. It is my belief that sometimes we citizens of Weatherby Lake live in a bubble of complacency. We do have 24 hour police coverage 365 days a year, but the one officer on duty can not be everywhere at one time and that is when bad things can happen; like the guy driving 45+ when our officer isn't around. The police department is being very proactive in calling you when you leave your garage door open. We offer security checks on your home when you are out of town. There is no other place in the area where that happens. We can't make you lock your car but know someone may walk around and steal it if the keys are in it. Lastly, a responsible adult should be with your children in any of our parks. An armed, escaped felon who had posted on social media that he would not be taken alive was found and arrested by our officer a little over a year ago. Our police are the best they can be. Help them by helping yourselves and be vigilant. Please.

Airport Noise -- Part 1

I hear about airplane noise about once a week or so. I worked at KCI for 39 years, with in flight dispatch for United Airlines. I have called the Airport Director of Operations on more than a couple of occasions to discuss this, knowing the constraints of Air Traffic Controllers. I asked a friend, Captain R.E. 'Bud' Potts a chief pilot for a large, worldwide commercial carrier to put into layman's terms our 'noise' issues. Because of space limitations here I'll have to begin with aircraft that are landing. The more lengthy, 'departing aircraft' will be covered in the next issue.

Regarding aircraft that are landing:

Many procedures are designed to reduce the 'noise footprint' of arriving aircraft. There is a period of time though that the pilots have to ensure that they are lined up for the runway (this is when aircraft are landing to the north). During this final landing phase, pilots are not permitted to accept shortcuts. **And when you are flying with those folks, you sure wouldn't want them taking a shortcut with you and your family onboard.

What are some of these procedures that help a plane fly quieter?

Pilots tell me that by delaying the landing flap extension, holding off on extending the landing gear until the appropriate time to put the wheels down, flying a slightly steeper initial approach that is both fuel efficient and quieter, adjusting airspeeds so that the throttles remain at a low power setting during the approach are but a few that are industry standard. Also, thankfully the newer generation of aircraft are significantly quieter than their earlier predecessors. Airport Noise Part 2 in the next Newsletter.

The Weatherby Lake Improvement Company wanted me to remind the members that **ALL** members are required to have their WLIC credentials visible while at WLIC access areas.

In past weeks the Police Department has been contacted regarding tall grass/weeds on private properties/lots. I would like to remind everyone regarding the city weeds, high grass or other vegetation ordinance. 215.030 which reads in part:

Failure To Keep Weeds, High Grass And Other Vegetation Cut And Removed, A Nuisance. All persons owning or occupying any lot or tract of land in the City shall keep the weeds, high grass and other vegetation growing on such property cut and removed. Whenever such weeds, high grass or other vegetation shall attain the height of eight (8) inches, it shall be deemed a public nuisance. The word "*weeds*", as used herein, shall be held to include all vegetable growths except cultivated plants, trees and shrubs.

Unlawful To Maintain Such Nuisance. It shall be unlawful for any person to create or maintain a nuisance as defined in Subsection (A) and violation hereof is punishable as set forth in Section [100.230](#) of this Code.

Liability. Whenever weeds, high grass or other vegetation in violation of Subsection (A) of this Section are allowed to grow on any part of any lot or ground within the City, the owner of the ground or, in case of joint tenancy, tenancy by entireties or tenancy in common, each owner thereof shall be liable.

Daily Violation. Each day that a nuisance shall be maintained is a separate offense.

Abatement Procedure. In addition to the ordinance violation punishable as set forth in Section [100.230](#) of this Code, the City may also abate the nuisance.

WLIC Update

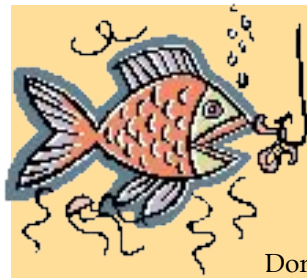
