Mayor's Comments

Springtime greetings from City Hall,

This coming Tuesday is Election Day. We have a choice between two candidates in both the East Ward, which now includes Hillside Drive due to redistricting, and the West Ward. Incumbent Alderman Doug Richmond is challenged by Paula York in the West Ward and East Ward Alderman Russ Monuski is challenged by Wilbur Stuhlman. Weatherby resident Dr. Michael Shafe is also running for the Platte County Health Department Board of Trustees. Exercise your right to vote Tuesday, April 4th!

About 4 years ago I wrote a two part article on 'Airplane Noise' and with the seasonal weather changing now is a timely opportunity to rerun it. The prevailing wind pattern will be more southerly now until late fall. We are just past the time of year (winter) when the wind primarily comes from the north. By design all aircraft get more airspeed for 'lift' when they take off into the wind. We have not had noticeable aircraft noise since last fall because they have been mostly taking off into the prevailing northerly wind. More often now aircraft are taking off to the south and the noise is more noticeable.

I have lived here for 34 years and have heard for years about a 'gentlemen's agreement' between former deceased residents Lance Welch and Joe Sherman with the FAA. Since I have become mayor I have searched City records and found nothing in writing about this. Since these two gentlemen are no longer with us I have to classify this as simply 'Urban Legend'.

For the 'Airplane Noise' I mentioned, I asked a friend, Captain RE 'Bud' Potts, a chief pilot for a large, commercial international air carrier to put into layman's terms our 'noise' issues. Because of space constraints he begins with aircraft that are landing which is 'Airplane Noise - Part 1'.

'Many procedures are designed to reduce the 'noise footprint' of arriving aircraft. There is a period of time that pilots have to ensure that they are lined up for the runway (this is when aircraft are landing to the north). During this final landing phase, pilots are not permitted to accept shortcuts. **And when you are flying with those folks, you sure wouldn't want them taking a shortcut with you and your family onboard.

What are some of these procedures that help a plane fly quieter? Pilots agree by delaying the landing flap extension, holding off on extending the landing gear until the appropriate time to put the wheels down, fly

ing slightly steeper initial approach that is both fuel efficient and quieter, adjusting airspeeds so that the throttles remain at a low power setting during the approach are but a few of the industry standards. Also thankfully the newer generation of aircraft is significantly quieter than their earlier predecessors.

We are blessed to have such a incredible airport near our neighborhood – and it sure makes it easier for our personal and professional travel—to easily get to faraway places, or to simply drop and pick up our families. We can't forget about the great deal of positive commerce that having an airport like MCI brings to the greater KC area. It has been proven not just in our community but communities across the USA that property values go up with convenient air travel options nearby.



Several times a year WLPD contacts citizens regarding their signs. All property owners are **responsible for the signs on their property.** Below is the Weatherby Lake sign ordinance, in part:

Section 405.240 Signs

A. All privately owned outdoor signs erected or maintained in the City of Weatherby Lake, Missouri, shall be erected and maintained in compliance with the following regulations. It shall be unlawful for any person or entity to erect, maintain or allow the display of any sign upon property under that person or entity's control which does not comply with this Section.

Sign Location: All signs shall be located at least fifteen (15) feet from the edge of the paved portion of the street and in no event shall such sign(s) be placed on City Hall, Community Center or Park property. No signs shall be affixed to any utility pole within the City limits of Weatherby Lake.

Sign Maintenance: All signs, including signs heretofore installed, shall be constantly maintained in a state of security, safety, repair and professional appearance. If any sign is found not to be so maintained or is insecurely fastened or otherwise dangerous, it shall be the duty of the owner and/or occupant of the premises on which the sign is fastened to repair or remove the sign within five (5) days after receiving notice from a City Official.

Sign Obstructing View or Passage: No sign shall be located so as to physically obstruct any door, window or exit from a building. No sign shall be located so as to be hazardous to a motorist's ingress or egress, or visibility of traffic flow during ingress or egress, from parking areas of any way open to the public.

Sign Height: No sign shall exceed a total height of six (6) feet.

Sign Size: No sign shall exceed five (5) square feet in area.

LAWNCARE PRACTICES



1. **Use low phosphorous fertilizer.** Brands appropriate for lake residents include Golf Course Starter (16-2-2), Loveland Renovator Pro (30-0-3), Loveland Summer Pro (20-0-5), or Loveland Weed and Feed (12-0-4). All of these products are available at Grass Pad on NW Barry Rd.
2. **Don't leave excess materials** like fertilizer and grass clippings in the street where stormwater will wash it into the lake. Blow excess from your drive, walkways AND the city street.
3. **Sweep up and dispose** of goose feces, pet waste & leaves. Never sweep it into the lake.
4. **Use low phosphorous soaps** to wash patio furniture, autos, and boats – brands like Simple Green® and Palmolive® 
5. **Consider having your soil tested** and customize your chemicals to the appropriate formula. Instructions and form can be found at <https://extension.missouri.edu/programs/soil-and-plant-testing-laboratory>. You may mail your sample and form in a securely sealed plastic bag to the University of Missouri address on the form (enclose check for \$12.50) or take the sample and form locally to the University of Missouri Extension office at 11724 NW Plaza Circle, Kansas City, MO with a check for \$20. Call 816-270-2141 for hours of operation. Then, bring the test results to Grass Pad, our environmental partner, and they can help you find the best formulation.

ADVICE FROM THE MISSOURI DEPT OF CONSERVATION



Weatherby Lake has a large wildlife population and some residents are inclined to want to interact with them by feeding them or encouraging them to get close. This can cause problems for both the animal and people, especially if the animal expects similar treatment from all humans.

People have good intentions, but this attention to wildlife by feeding them, or the attempted care, taming, or rehabilitation of wildlife is not in the best interests of the animals. Frequently a young animal may appear to have been abandoned, but most likely the parent is nearby and any attempt from a human to rescue it will most likely interrupt its natural adapting.

Wildlife can become dangerous, and can also carry parasites, disease, and have the potential to damage property.

Native wildlife can carry mites, ticks, lice, fleas, roundworms, tapeworms, rabies, distemper, tuberculosis, respiratory diseases, and skin diseases. Some of these can be transmitted to humans and their domestic pets.

The best help people can offer to wildlife is to leave them alone. Be a good neighbor to both wildlife and people.



It's Time for Goose Eggs

Late March, early April is the time when geese build their nests and lay eggs. Nests are usually near the shoreline and are made of twigs, leaves and dried grasses. They often have feathers strewn about. If you think you see a nest on or near your property, please call the W.L.I.C. at 741-5556 so licensed conservationists can investigate. Goose feces is a primary contributor for lake contamination and closures. Let's work together to keep the lake clean!

Let us know if you would like to participate. We are eager to welcome your ideas.




