### Mayor's Comments

Well it's finally that special time of year again that we have the privilege to enjoy our beloved Weatherby Lake. I look forward to many relaxing days and evenings of just floating on the water!

Recently we lost a very long time resident here at Weatherby, Mabel Phillips. Mabel and her husband Lyle have lived here for over 50 years and recently celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary. They along with their two daughters have been very involved in almost every group and committee here at Weatherby Lake. Our condolences to Lyle, their two daughters and to all of Mabel's family and friends.

On behalf of the Weatherby Lake Police Department and the City, my sincere thanks and appreciation go out to Michael and Julie Horseman and the entire Irish-American Committee for all of their time, talent and resources in the planning and implementing the St Patrick's De Mayo event on the 14th of May! The weather cooperated for a perfect day for the parade and enabled the party to move outside on the patio at the Community Center. To the Horseman's, all of the volunteers who worked on this, the folks who contributed silent and live auction items, and the bidders ---- THANK YOU ALL!

We are in the process of having our now nearly 20 year old water tower worked on and freshened up. At this writing we have drained it and the contractors who built it originally are washing the bowl and adding a new stainless steel ladder inside to replace an old rope ladder. In addition they are upgrading plumbing in the base and washing the exterior. All of this work is being paid for by money that your Board of Aldermen has set aside in the last few years.

The public works guys are constantly maintaining our streets and that involves patching holes, crack sealing open seams and mowing the right of ways. We are going to have lines painted on some of the curves on both East and West sides. On Eastside Drive we are going to put a crosswalk at 79th Street. There will be warning signs for this at the top of the hills going in each direction and also markings at the crosswalk. Besides being requested by the nearby neighbors we feel it will have a traffic calming effect to slow vehicles down.

In addition to the above we are going to repave Rocky Point around to Forest Drive and on to Barry Road and also the 73rd Street cul-de-sac off of Eastside Drive.

The Park Board has again booked 4 'Concerts in the Park' this summer, all to take place at Cristhaven Park on Roberts Road. Check this Newsletter for dates and times.

Alderman Tanya Finn has announced that this year's theme for the 4th of July festivities is 'Maui Wowie' or something else Maui related. We are still working on the parade route and where it is going to end up but look for the annual mailer that will have all of that information on it. As usual we end the day with a fantastic fireworks display off of the dam which is fully funded by YOU. This year we have again 'upped the ante' to \$25,000. Drop off your tax deductible contributions at City Hall.

This year's 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade route is yet to be determined and when finalized will be printed in the yearly flyer and posted on the city website.

As the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday is approaching it is important to know the city ordinance regulations on fireworks. Weatherby Lake Ordinance #210.225 Fireworks reads in part:

The following types of fireworks are always prohibited within the City of Weatherby Lake, and it <u>shall be unlawful</u> for any person to carry on or about his/her person, use or display the following (unless authorized by the provisions of Subsection (**F**)of this Section):

All aerial devices. Including, but not limited to, sky rockets, missile-type rockets, bottle rockets, helicopter aerial spinners, Roman candles and mine shells.

Audible ground devices. Containing over twenty-five (25) milligrams of pyrotechnic composition, including, but not limited to, firecrackers, chasers, M-80's, cherry bombs, etc.

The following types of fireworks <u>are allowed</u> within the City limits of Weatherby Lake on July 2, 3 and 4 between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 10:00 P.M.:

Ground and hand-held sparkling devices. Such as sparklers, cane fountains, wheels and ground spinners.

Audible ground devices. Containing twenty-five (25) milligrams or less of pyrotechnic composition, such as small firecrackers and lady fingers.

*Novelties and trick noisemakers*. Not classified as common fireworks by the United States Department of Transportation, such as snakes, smoke devices and snappers.

The Weatherby Lake Improvement Company wishes to remind everyone that **NO FIREWORKS** are allowed on WLIC property.

# **WLIC Update**

The first round of dock and boat inspections has been completed and if you haven't done what you were supposed to do by May 1, you got a letter and maybe and invoice from us. Please note that the second round of inspections is scheduled for June 3rd and, if you don't want to hear from us again, make sure your stickers and any needed repairs have been made.

As a reminder, the Lake Season Kickoff is scheduled for June 5th at C Point from 11 AM to 1 PM. There some clubs will be providing activities for the whole family and ice cream for all, courtesy of the WLIC.

Also, with schools adjourned for the summer, please be courteous on the Lake and all of our Access Areas. No one wants to hear loud music and foul language at all hours on the Lake. Make sure we don't need to issue warnings and/or fines for such behavior. This includes the adults, as well as the kids

Finally, the WLIC is still looking for Water Patrol and Gate Monitors for the summer season. Please contact the WIIC Office if you are interested.

We are looking forward to an active and enjoyable lake season and hope to see you on the Lake.



#### **WLIC Holiday Rules**

Wristbands will be checked at Access Areas. Violations will not include a written warning. Fireworks are prohibited on all WLIC Property.




#### **C-Point**

- Space is limited—access granted on a first come, first serve basis no overnight set-ups.
   CPT dock holders will be granted access to their docks at all times.
- Parking: limited to vehicles w/ city or WLIC sticker. One space per vehicle. No parking on grass. No trailer parking— park trailers at City Hall or C-Cove.
- Credentials must be worn and visible at gate check. Escort Guests from the gate.
- Swim dock tie ups limited to 3 boats deep.
- · Tents on the Pavilion point are not allowed.

#### **Pease Property**

- Limited seating area will be designated for fireworks viewing.
- No boats moored at the courtesy docks after 7:00pm.





#### BE MINDFUL OF THE FIRELINE

Please watch out for the buoys while out on the water. During the fireworks display, you will need to keep your boat behind this line for safety reasons. DO NOT CROSS THE FIRE-LINE until the fire department/Water Patrol sounds the "all clear".

#### Prevention Pete Says...Be safe out on the water!

- Have proper night-time navigational lighting! You will be returned to shore and fined. Use docking lights when docking only.
- Swim from boats anchored behind NO WAKE buoys, not in the main channel. Night Swimming: Permitted in adequately lit areas only. No swimming/lilypads off boats during fireworks.
- Don't ride on top-decks while underway.
- Flotilla limitations Swim dock tie ups limited to 3 boats deep.
   Beginning at 5pm, limit to 5 tie-ups per flotilla.
- Stay inside the gated area of your boat. No dangling of feet over the edge of pontoon while underway.
- Paddleboarding ends 30 minutes before sunset.



#### WEATHERBY LAKE RESIDENT HONORED

(Thanks to WL resident, Lynn Hinkle Roberts, and The Platte County Citizen for the following information.

Longtime Weatherby Lake resident **Carlton Philpot**, a retired U.S. Navy Commander, was inducted into the Fort Leavenworth Hall of Fame on May 10th, along with the late Major General Raymond Barton, Commander of the Fourth Infantry Battalion in WWII. The Hall of Fame honors "outstanding military and civilian leaders of the Armed Forces of the United States who have served at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, and made a significant contribution to the achievement, tradition, or history of Fort Leavenworth and the Armed Forces of the United States."

Commander Philpot is the first Navy man in the Army fort's Hall of Fame. He was honored for more than three decades of work recognizing the contributions and honorable service of African American military units and individuals. At Fort Leavenworth, he led the largest such undertaking at the request of General Colin Powell, a \$1.3 million installation of a bronze Buffalo Soldier on horseback by artist Eddie Dixon, which was dedicated by Gen. Powell in 1992 behind Lewis & Clark Hall, where the Fort's Hall of Fame is housed. Both Meriwether Lewis and William Clark are members of the Hall of Fame, as are Generals Dwight Eisenhower and Colin Powell.

The seventh and most recent monument in Buffalo Soldier Park that Carlton spent endless hours developing was dedicated in 2018 and honors the 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion, the only predominantly black Women's Army Corps unit deployed overseas during WWII. Commander Philpot recognized John Freshnock of WSKF Architects headquartered in North Kansas City, who donated his firm's services for the 6888th monument.

Attending the ceremony and unveiling of the Hall of Fame shadow box with Carlton were his wife Othello

Philpot and their two daughters, Trina Montano and Karla Dozier, grandsons, and son-in-law.

Commander Philpot was an instructor at the Command and General Staff College from 1989-1994, and after retirement from the Navy he started the first Navy JROTC at a Job Corps Center in Excelsior Springs.

In his acceptance speech, he gave all glory to God and spoke of those who had passed before this day, including his mother, Mrs. Daisy Philpot. He reflected on the pride he felt at being mentioned in Gen. Powell's autobiography, "My American Journey".




