Mayors Comments

Did 'back to school' happen soon enough for everyone? I'm pretty sure for most of those younger than 15, it happened way too soon.

I hope everyone took in at least one of the Park Board concerts this summer. The concert on August 17th featured local group The 9.9er's. Our Park Board even fed the first 100 folks for the first time ever! This completed the 10th season of the Gene Roberts Concert Series. Next years musical groups have already been lined up by the Godfather and longtime member of the Park Board, Gene Roberts. Thanks Gene for your long time commitment to our Park Board!

The first organizational meeting of the City's Long Range Planning Committee met on August 21st. Stay tuned for further information on opportunities to get involved.

Public Works Director, George Lowman and Mayor Pro-Tem, Doug Richmond met with officials of Water District #6 in early August to discuss the need for a mutually beneficial alternative water source for our city and the customers of Water District #6. Weatherby Lake purchases water from the City of Kansas City. Water District #6 buys theirs from American Water in Parkville. At this point we have agreed to share the expenses of installing the plumbing necessary to tap into each others water source should an interruption occur. It is anticipated that this be formalized and completed within the next few months.

Speaking of plumbing, the process of the long awaited Sewer Lift Station issue seems close to having all 'blockages' being cleared within the next 2 months or so. The activity on Westside Drive at 'O Cove' is in preparation of that. The Kansas City City Council has passed nearly all the necessary approvals.

The Annual Jeremy Katzenberger Memorial Triathlon will take place in our city Sunday morning September 9th from 8-11 AM, It is a very worthy cause for all survivors of fallen Service Members and is named for a former Weatherby resident who grew up here.

This year the Citywide Cleanup will be from Friday, September 21st thru Sunday the 23rd. Hours are 730AM to 500PM. This is for Weatherby Lake residents only. Please make sure your vehicle sticker is in place otherwise you may be turned away. Remember only yard waste will be accepted. Follow the signs at City Hall.



Kops Korner

The department has received complaints from residents regarding receiving fraudulent or scam phone calls, both on their home phone and cellular phones. Unfortunately this practice is growing and is common place in today's society. As technology has developed so has the availability to alter incoming phone numbers on caller I.D. to make the recipient believe the call is from a local or U.S. phone number. These phone "scam" calls can falsely represent government institutions and private industry from the FBI, IRS and banking services. All of these scam calls have one thing in common and that is to **exploit funds** or **your identity** from you. I urge everyone to be cautious of these scams and to be aware of all information you provide over the phone. **If you believe you are a victim of a phone or online scam, you can file an online complaint with the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center at: <https://www.ic3.gov>.**

It has been brought to my attention that several residents do not wish to utilize the Online residence check form. The residence check paper document can be located on the city's web page:

<https://www.ic3.gov/default.aspx> >Document Center>Police Department>Residence Check Request. The paper form can be printed, **legibly completed** and brought to city hall during business hours. You may also contact the Police Department by phone 816-741-8111 and an Officer will complete the residence check request for you.

As a reminder the annual Jeremy Katzenberger Memorial Triathlon will be held on Sunday September 9th, 2018. The participants will be competing on several city streets so I urge all motorists to **use caution** during this event. The Weatherby Lake Improvement Company wanted me to remind the members that all members are required to have their WLIC credentials visible while at WLIC access areas.

In the past weeks the Police Department has been called to several WLIC access areas on, "Trespassers" because the automobiles parked in these access areas are not displaying a Weatherby Lake City license or WLIC Non-Resident sticker. **City ordinance 385.150 reads in part:**

It shall be unlawful for any person who is a resident of Weatherby Lake to operate a motor vehicle without a valid City license.

It shall be unlawful for any person who is a resident of Weatherby Lake to operate a motor vehicle in the City of Weatherby Lake without displaying a valid City license in the lower left corner (driver's side) of the windshield.

City vehicle licenses are available at city hall Monday-Friday 8:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m.

WLIC Update

As we approach Labor Day, the WLIC is focused on its regular fall activities, i.e. Annual Meeting preparation, Triathlon assistance, C Point winterization, etc. We would also like to bring Members up to date on our plans for the 10208 NW 73rd St. property (east of the Dam).

As you are hopefully aware, the WLIC purchased this property last November to allow us to better control access to and provide increased protection for the Dam. Since that time, the WLIC has reached out to the Membership in the following ways:

- Conducted five open houses for our Members to inspect the property
- Conducted multiple online surveys of our Membership for their recommendations for the use of the property.
- We have also used the Long Range Planning committee monthly meetings to discuss and develop long term options for the property to best enhance the Lake's value to our Members.

Since the WLIC acquired the property we have removed some of the dead trees, taken out a rock wall which protruded near the street and removed the previously found asbestos material in the house. Currently, the WLIC has engaged Affinis, it's long time Dam engineers, to perform an impact study regarding the various options for the property and the structural integrity of the Dam. We are also engaging on independent engineering firm to validate the structural viability of the house and the cost of any improvements necessary to maintain it.

The WLIC is committed to proceeding cautiously and carefully evaluating all of our options and avoid taking short term actions we will regret later. As always, we will communicate fully with our Members with continued open meetings, which we encourage you all to attend ,and posting on the WLIC website and Facebook page.
