### Mayor's Office

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

As the Labor Day weekend approaches, we are reminded that another summer season is drawing to a close. This summer has been a particularly hot one with much humidity and after what seemed to be a 3 week dry spell, the last week of August has produced a week of thunder storms. Lots of extremes for everyone to deal with.

The installation of the Google Fiber Network continues around the city. The work teams have been diligent in ensuring that road closures have been held to a minimum. I meet every Friday with the Google team leaders, George Lowman, and the Board of Alderman representative Doug Richmond to discuss project status and review any issues for the ensuing week. I am happy to report that the project continues to be on track. My thanks to all the residents for their patience during this huge project.

I am very pleased to report that again this year that the City's proposed tax rate will decrease. The current tax rate is \$1.6912 per \$100 of assessed property value and the proposed new tax rate will be reduced to \$1.6500 per \$100 of assessed property value. Based on the current year assessed valuation, I anticipate an increase in tax revenue to the city of 2.068%. It has been my pleasure to work with the our Treasurer, Marianne Ennett, the City of Weatherby Lake staff, and the Board of Aldermen to ensure we continue to provide a fiscally responsible approach to the financial management of our City's resources.

On a safety note, please remember that the schools are now back in session. So please pay special attention while driving for school bus pickups and children crossing the streets.

The Royals finally broke out of their July slump and are playing much better ball in the month of August. Let's hope they continue their winning ways and have a great month of September. Oh, and did I mention the Chiefs are in camp up in St. Joe? Only a week to go before their season opener.

Lastly, on behalf of the City of Weatherby Lake I have partnered with the Daughters of the American Revolution to recognize the two hundred twenty-ninth anniversary of the signing of the Constitution by issuing a Proclamation proclaiming the week of September 17 – 23, 2016 as Constitution Week. I urge all citizens to reflect during that week on the many benefits of our Federal Constitution and privileges and responsibilities of American citizenship.

I hope you all have had a safe and wonderful summer here at the lake. Last year, the City of Weatherby Lake began utilizing a new communications tool that allows residents to receive community alerts and advisories via email and text message. This service, called Nixle, is free to use (standard text messaging fees apply) and allows the City to send out timely information on topics like severe weather warnings, road construction, traffic accidents, missing person alerts, and more.

To sign up for Nixle, visit www.nixle.com and follow the registration steps, or click on the Nixle widget on the City Web Page. You can choose to receive information via text message, email or directly at the Nixle website. You can also sign up to follow multiple agencies, which is beneficial if you want to keep track of what's happening in the communities where you work or visit or if you have loved ones living out of town. Nixle is a great resource that allows us to easily reach followers with critical information related to our community. This tool allows residents to get updates directly from city staff in a timely manner.

No legitimate lottery should ask you for money to claim your prize. Please call the police if you receive any offers you believe may be a scam.

Timing is everything, please call the police at the time you see or hear anything suspicious. Callers often report people and actions that occurred hours or sometimes days earlier. The police department really appreciates the information; however, timing can be critical to solving or preventing a crime. One of the best ways to prevent crime is to be aware of what happens around you and to report anything suspicious to the police department. Don't hesitate, call **911 immediately**. Even though it may seem unimportant at the time, please call. It could prevent a crime, help catch a criminal or possibly save a life.

#### W.L.I.C. Update

It's the time of year that the WLIC starts to prepare for its Annual Meeting. Remember, since it's a federal election year, the date of the Annual meeting is one week earlier, 7:00 PM, November 1, 2016, at the Hilton Airport Inn. Please mark your calendar accordingly.

You should have received a letter or an email from the WLIC notifying you that the WLIC will begin lowering the Lake approximately two feet to facilitate seawall repair by Members and the WLIC. Please refer to the letter or call the WLIC Office for more details. The "Call for Directors" Notice has also been sent to the Members. If you are desiring to run, you have until

September 16<sup>th</sup> to submit your nomination. Nominations will also be accepted from the floor at the Annual Meeting.

Members may have noted that cleanup has begun in Rush Creek, North of Barry Rd., on the property owned by the WLIC known as "The Beanfield".

The cleanup is part of an ongoing effort to improve the water quality of the Lake and is funded, in part, by a grant from the Platte County Stormwater Program. The work should be completed this fall. The WLIC continues to have meetings with the City of Kansas City, the MO Department of Natural Resources and various contractors and developers in the area to develop and elicit support for a comprehensive watershed protection strategy.

The Dam was inspected last month and we are pleased to inform that our Registration Permit has been renewed for another two years. Also, we would like to share that the west side of O Cove has been improved with a riprap seawall and gravel path for your use.

Lastly, unfortunately the Missouri Department of Conservation has reported that the **Zebra Mussel infestation at Truman Lake in Missouri has escalated. And, Cedar Bluff Reservoir in Kansas has become infested.** So please, remember to use only Weatherby Lake dedicated equipment so we can continue to spread the message, not the mussels!

As the Lake Season comes to a close, the WLIC wishes all its Members a safe and beautiful Fall.

Oct. 31: Samhain, the Celtic New Year and harvest festival, pronounced in Gaelic as "sow-ween" ... known in American English as "Halloween"


Nov. 1: All Saint's Day

So, you are quietly motoring in your pontoon boat on a Sunday afternoon when you suddenly see one or more sailboats rapidly approaching you. Oh my, you say to yourself. What should I do?

Generally, the Inland Rules of the Road, as promulgated by the United States Coast Guard, governs the operations of vessels on Weatherby Lake. In the situation above, when a motor driven boat and a sailboat are proceeding in such directions as to involve the risk of a collision, the motor or engine boat shall keep out of the way of the sailing boat. The motor driven boat shall, if necessary, slacken her speed or stop or reverse.

W.L.I.C. Regulations also state that no person shall operate a motor boat on the lake through or near a sailing competition ................................. or otherwise interfere with the competition.

Everyone has a right to enjoy our fantastic lake and amenities. The WLYC sailors enjoy competing for a couple of hours most Sunday afternoons during the racing season. Please, keep an eye out for them, enjoy the sights and sounds of yachts racing, and remember - they do not have a reverse gear!! Sailboat racing on Sunday is a scored sport competition.
